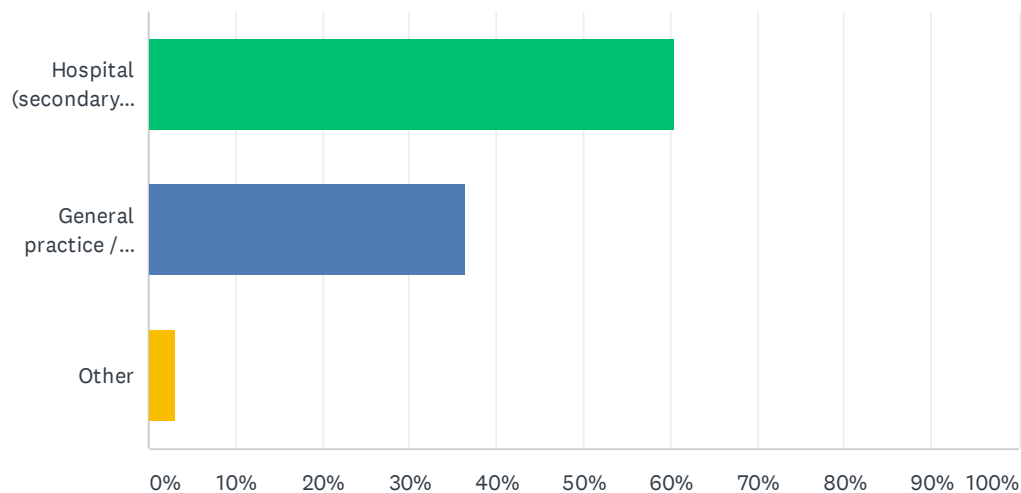


In which setting do you currently mainly work?

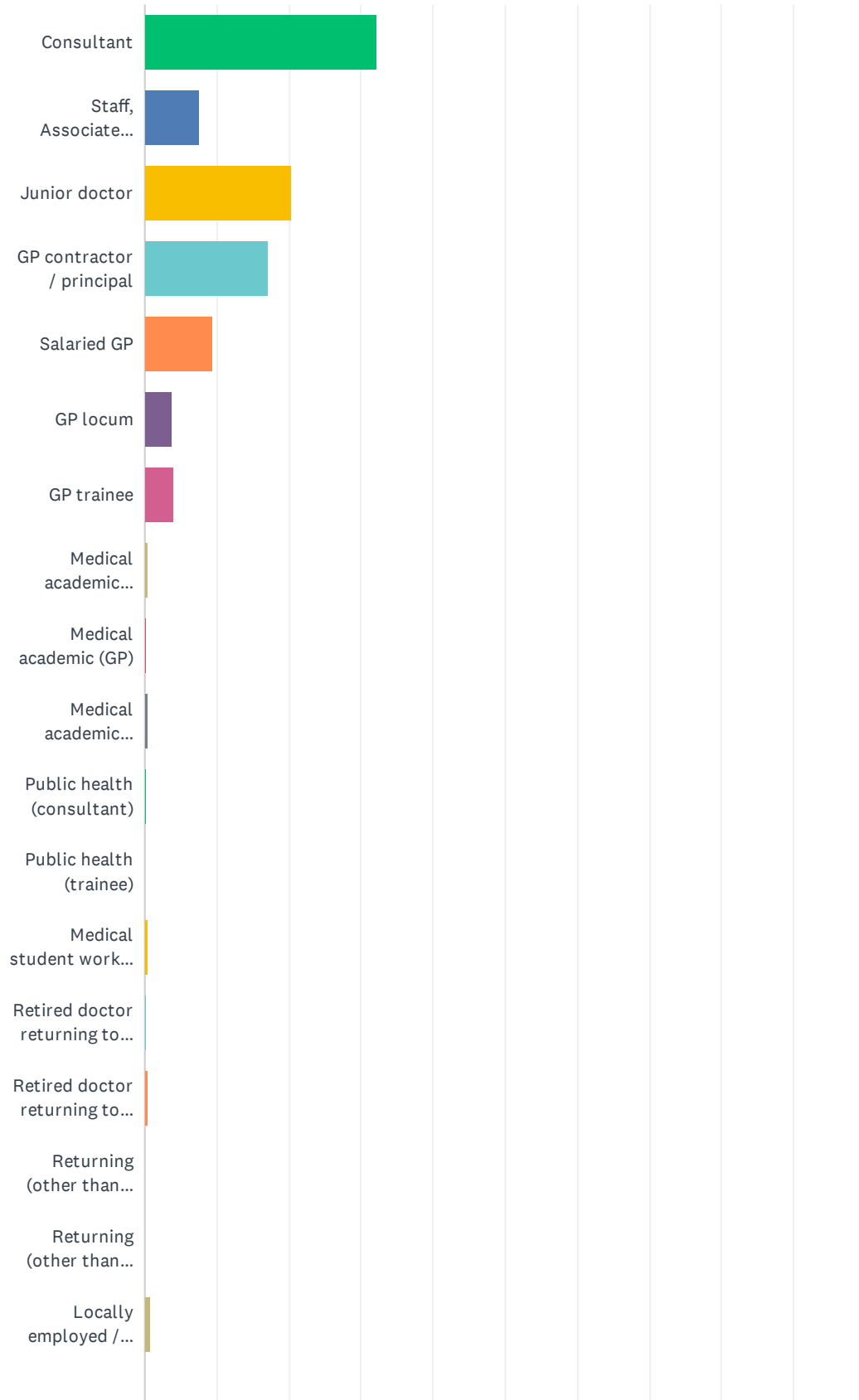

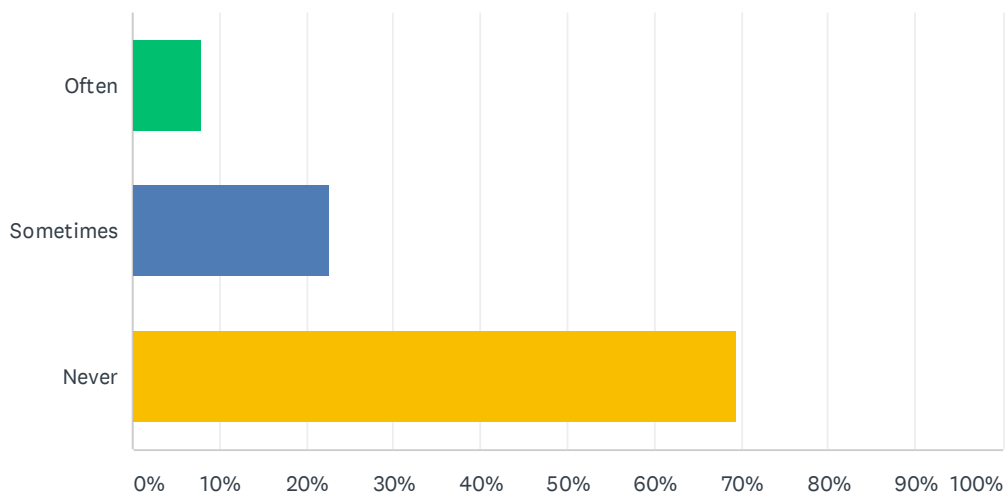

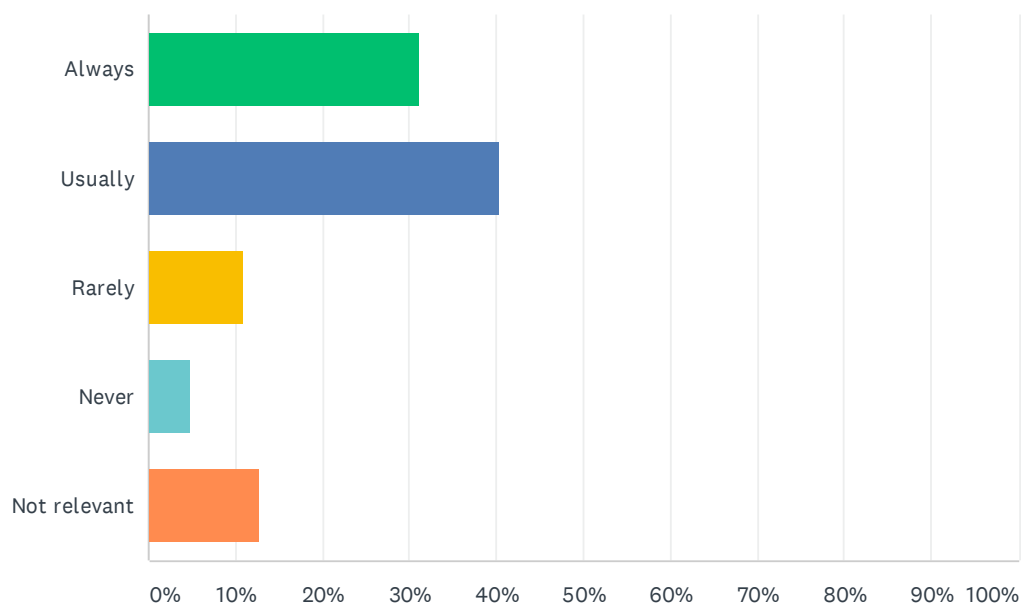

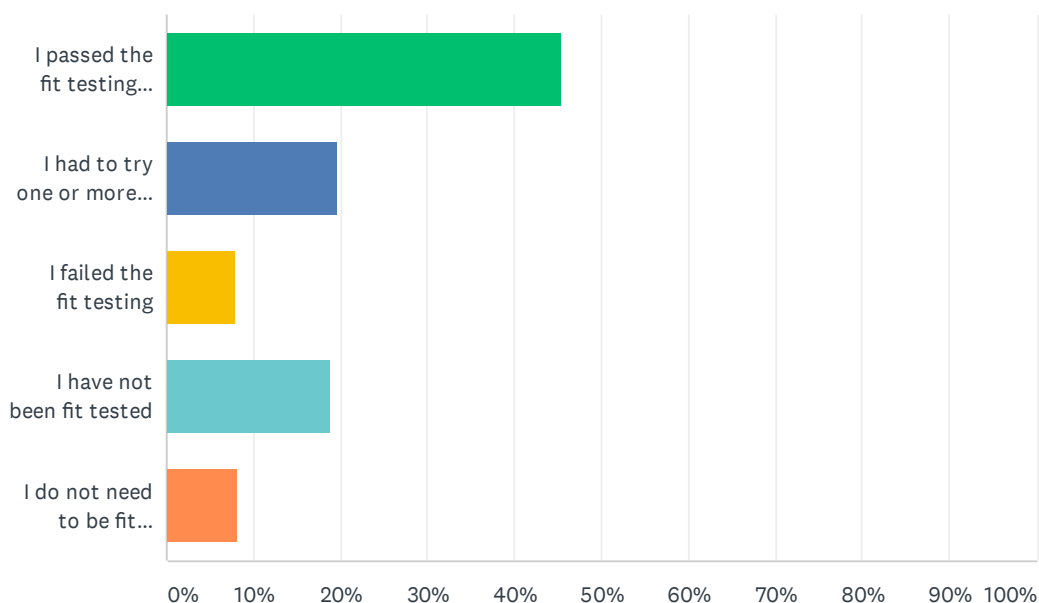

If you have been fit tested for a mask/respirator, which of the following best describes your experience?

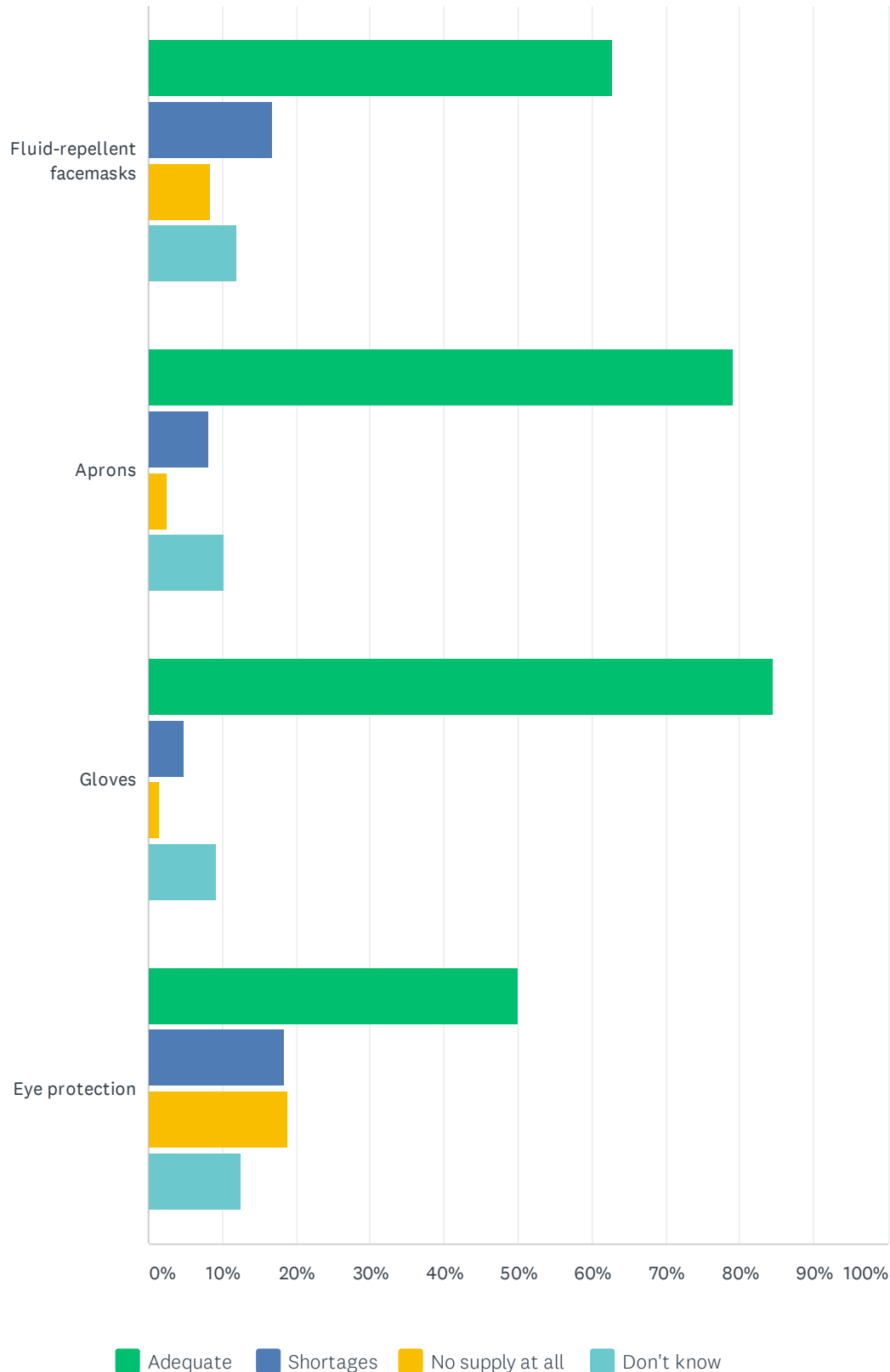

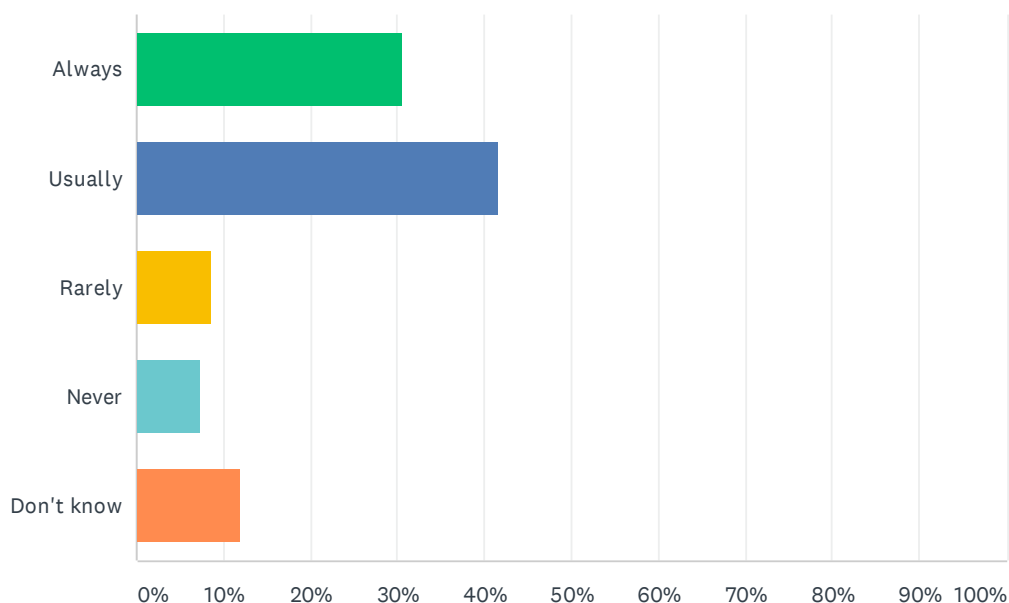

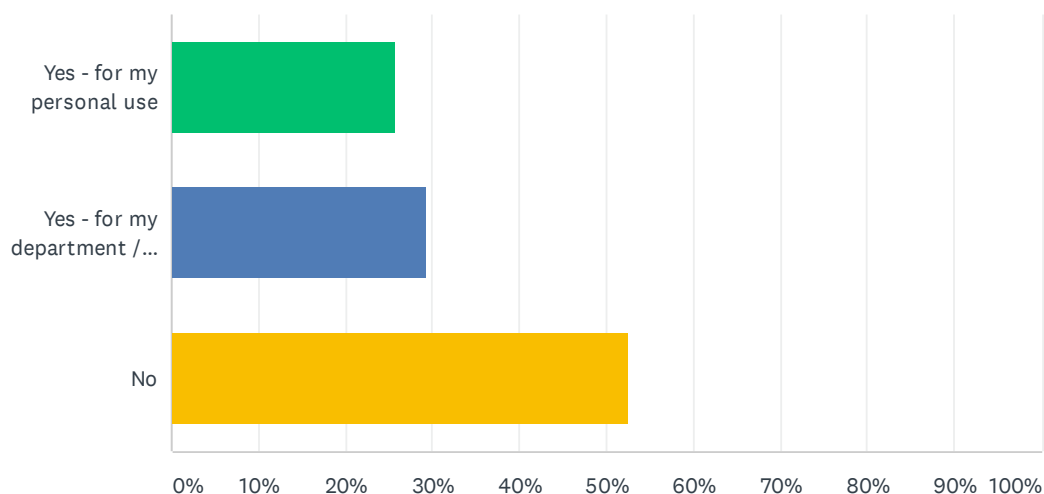

Have you had to purchase items of PPE directly yourself, or received supplies as an external donation (e.g. charity, local firms), due to non-availability of official NHS procurement supplies?

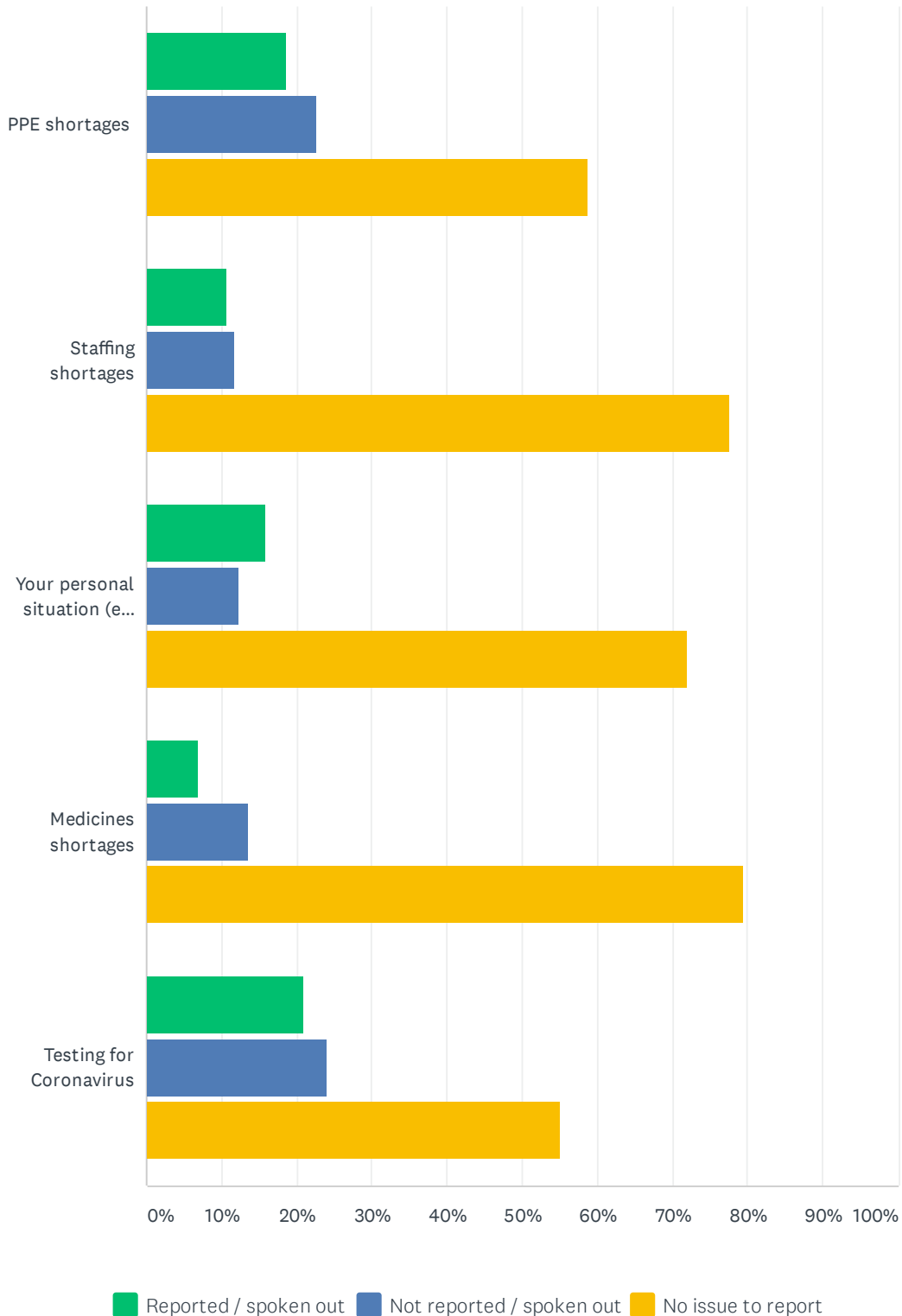

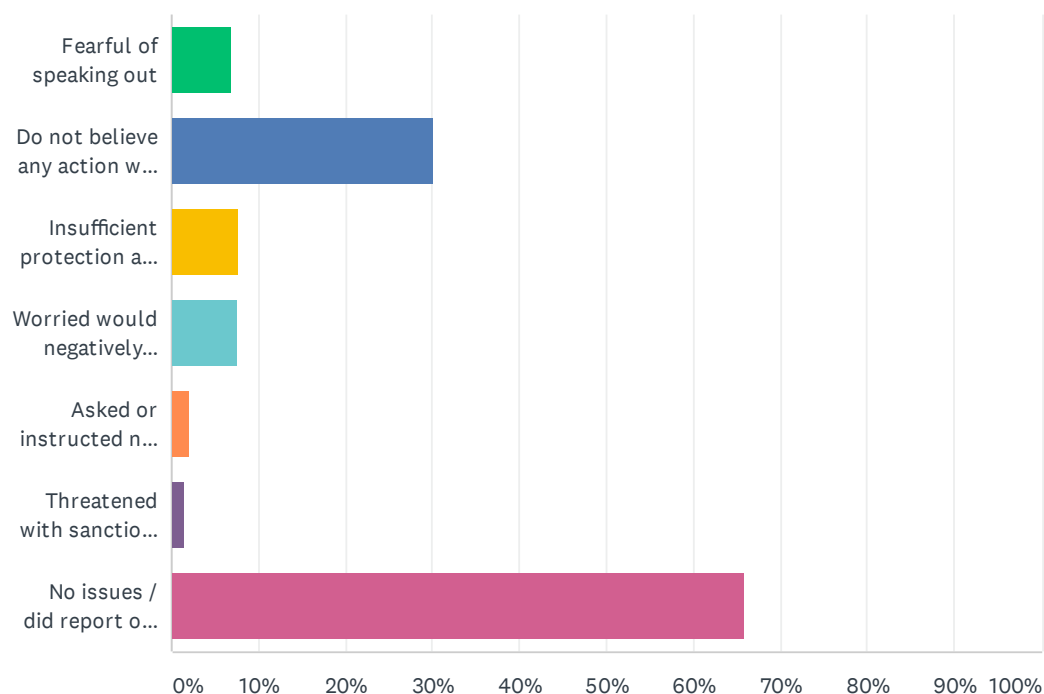

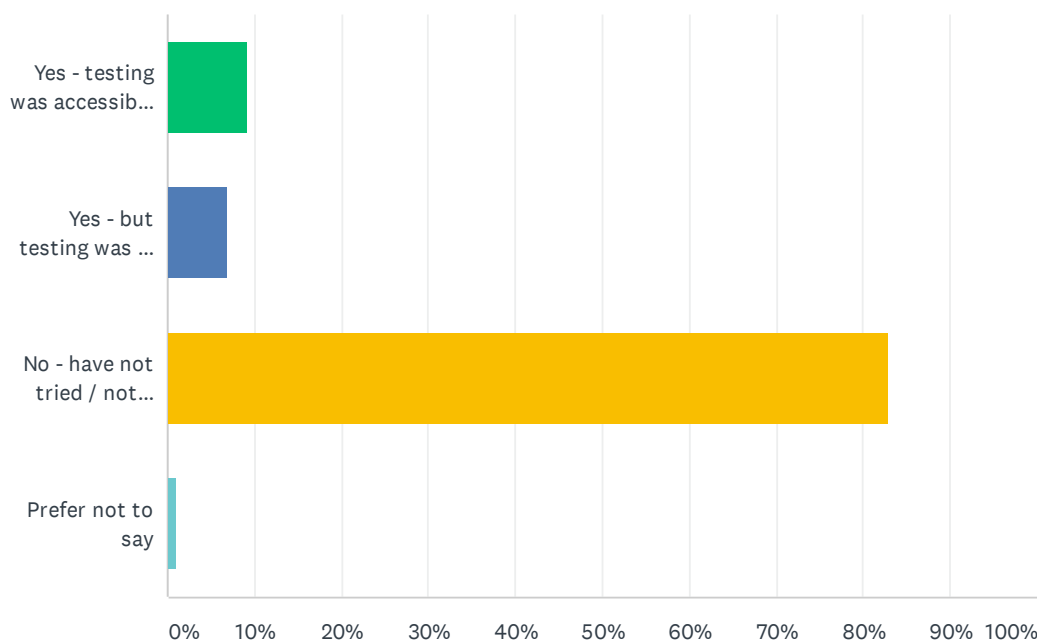

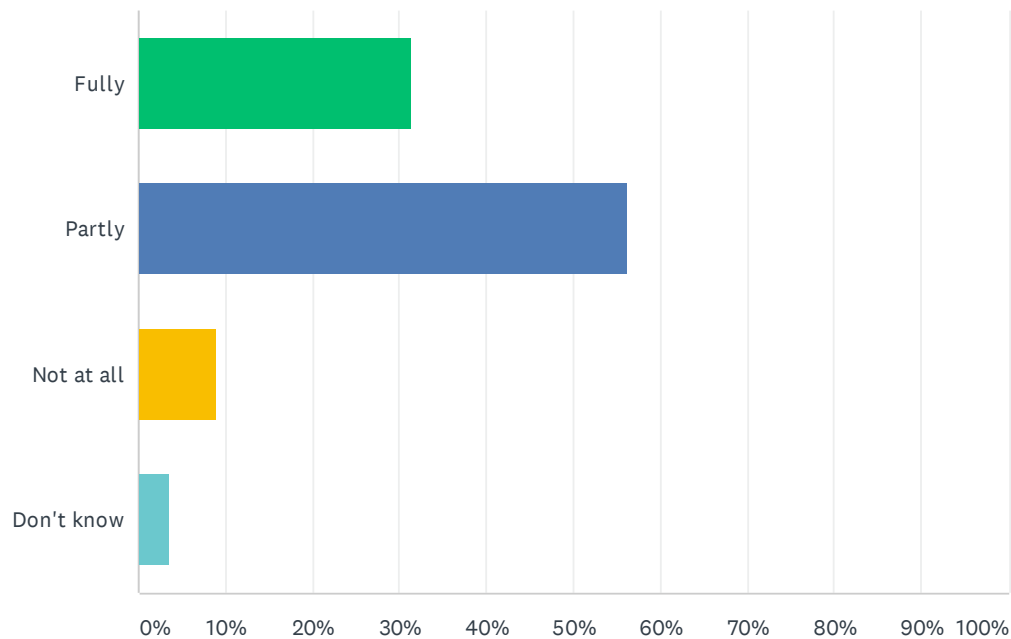

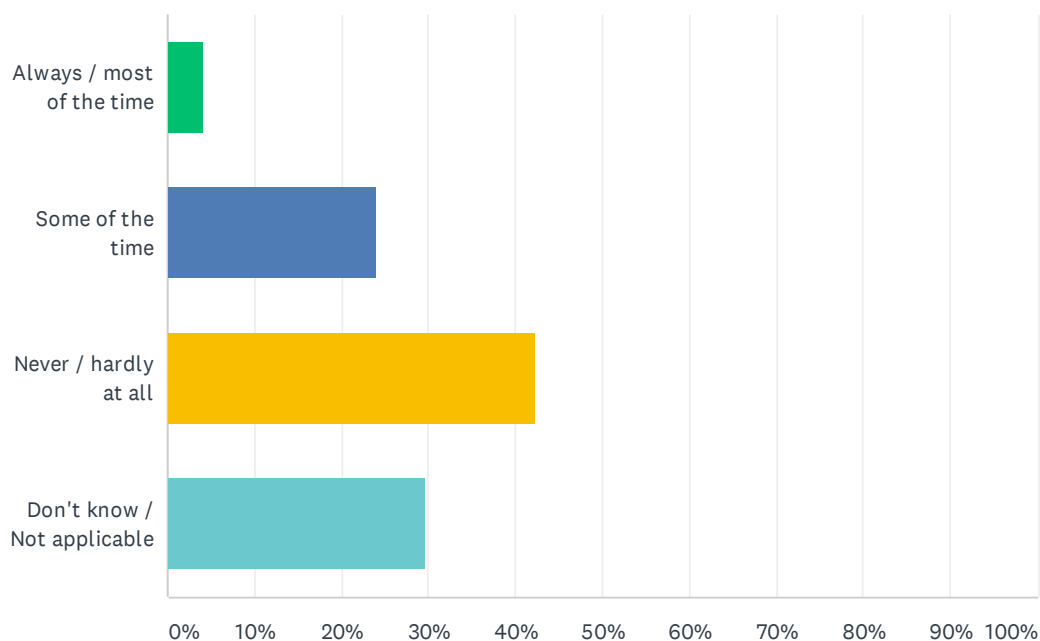

How frequently, if at all, are you experiencing any shortages of medicines, medical gases (e.g. oxygen) or other therapeutics in your place of work?

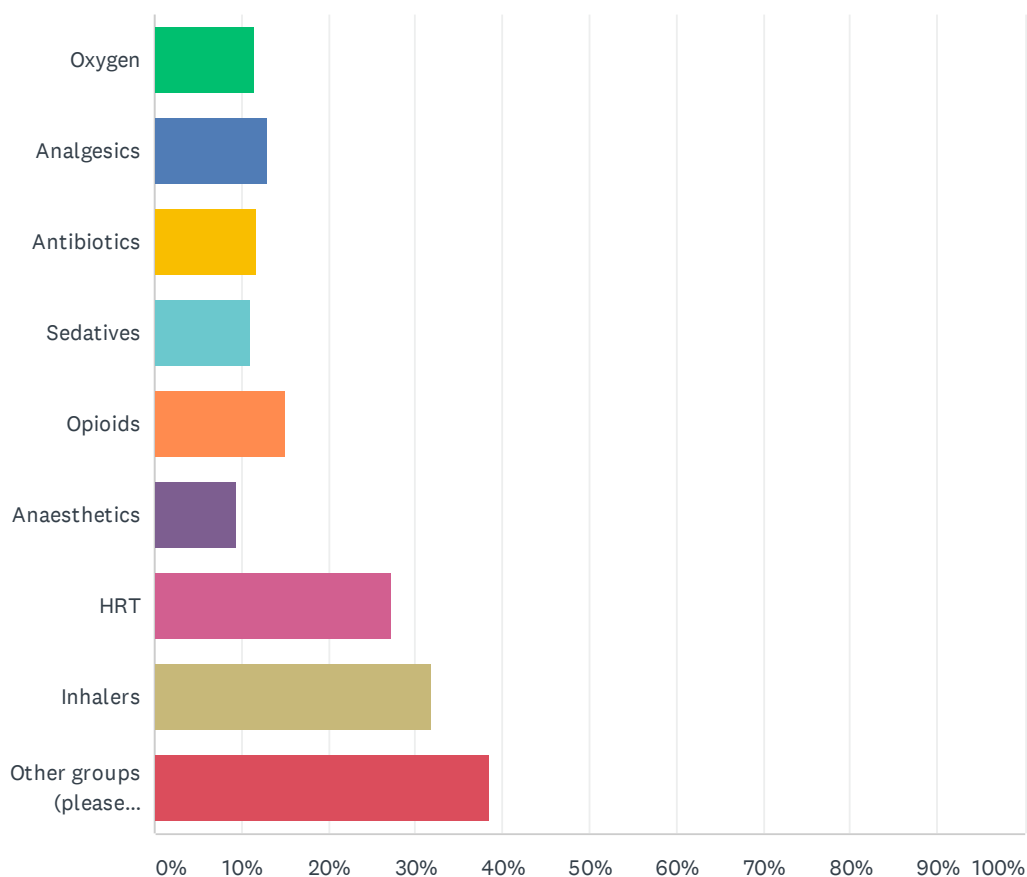

Which, if any, groups of medicines are you experiencing shortages of, compared with the situation pre-pandemic?

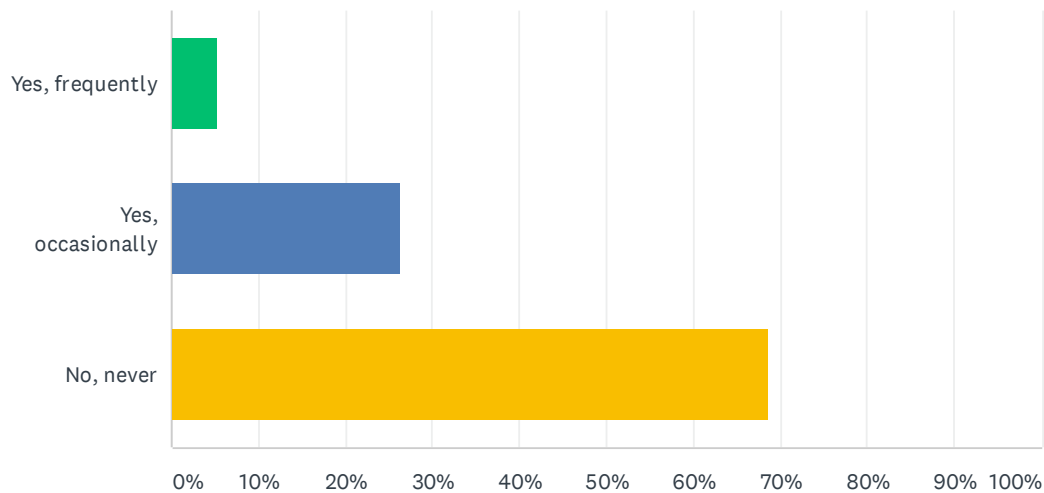

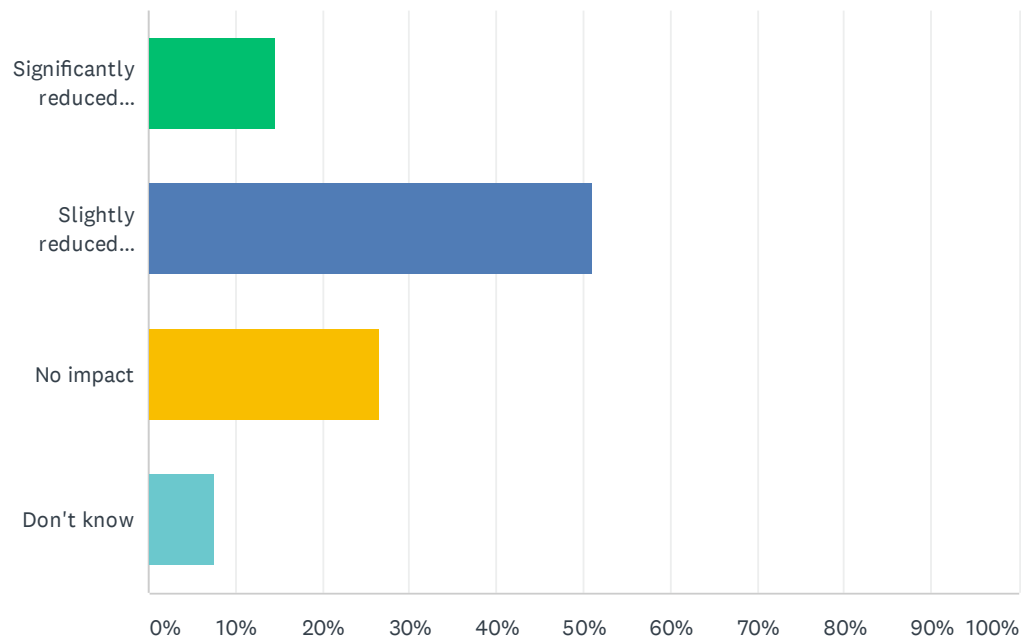

What impact is self-isolation having in your place of work with regard to staffing capacity and workload?

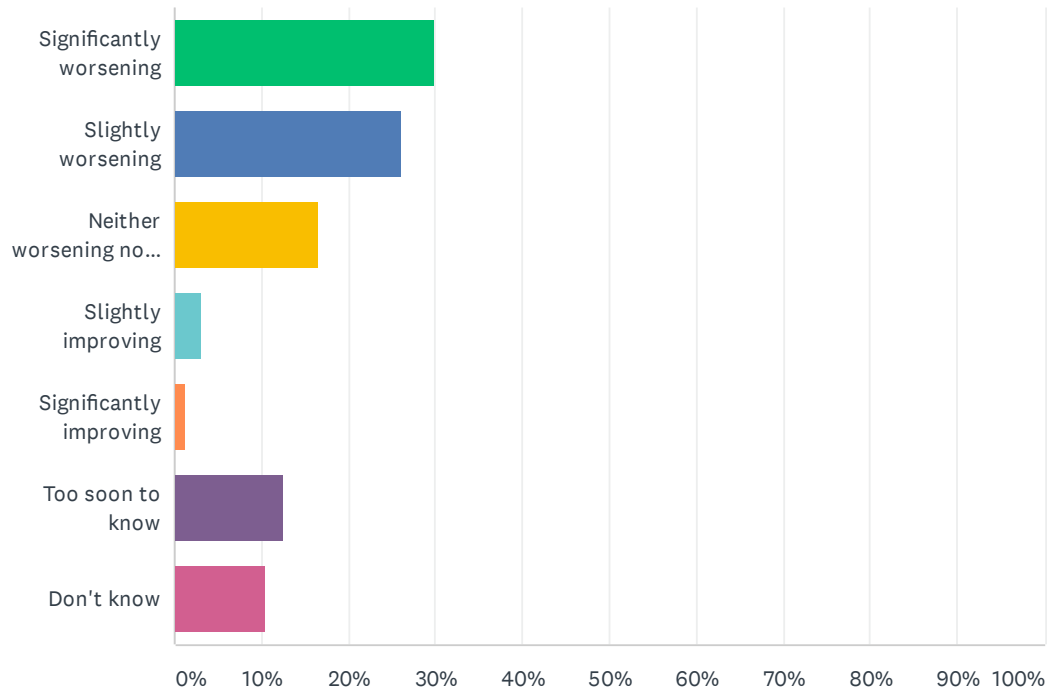

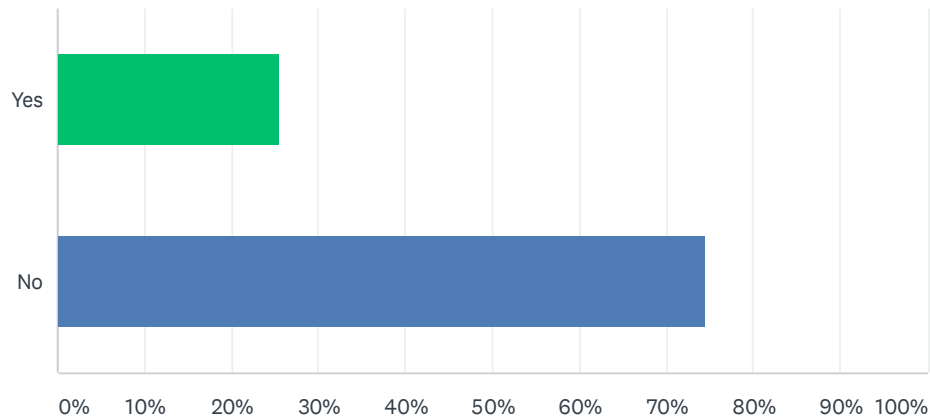

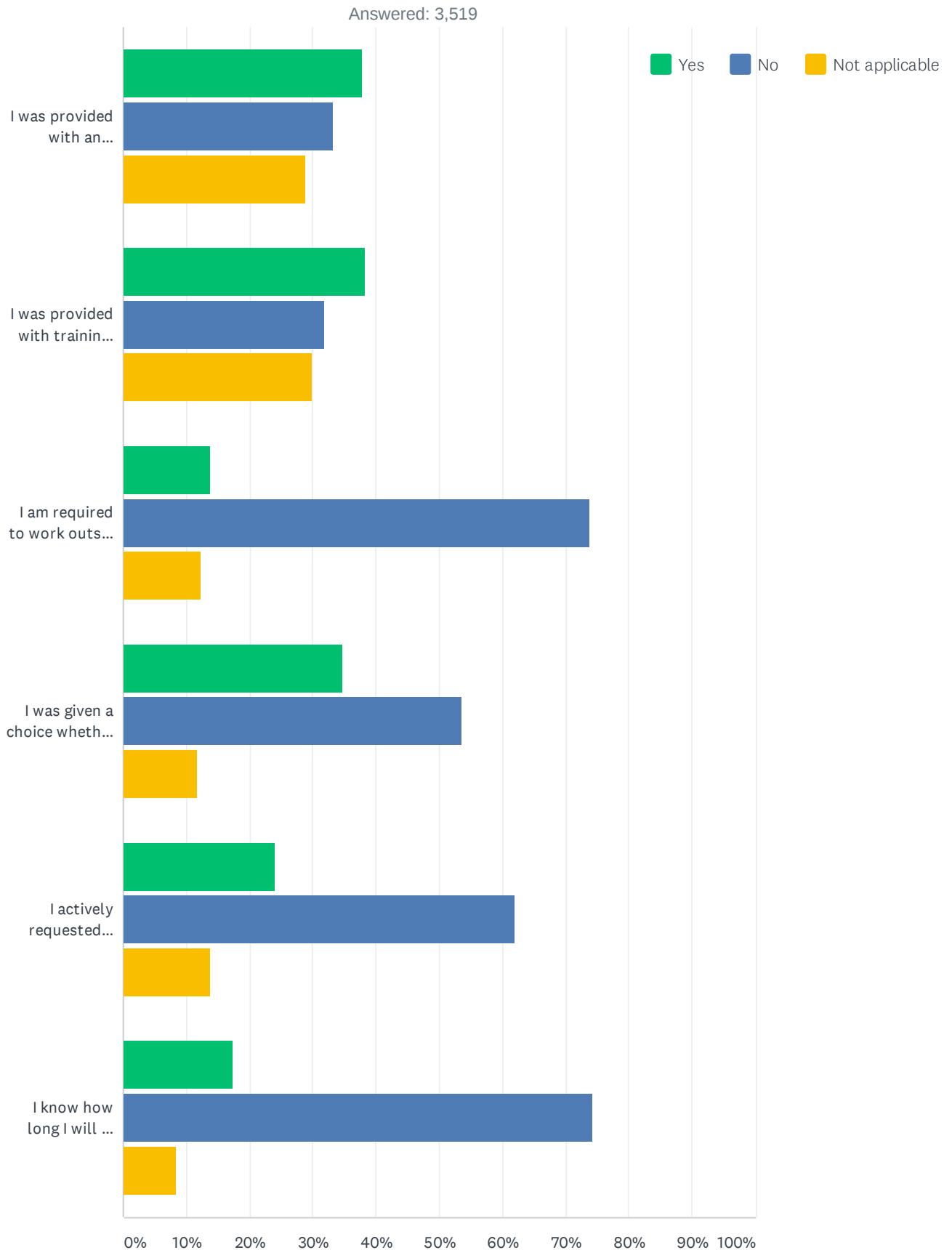
During this pandemic, have you been redeployed into a different role (e.g. grade, specialty, place of work) to your usual one?

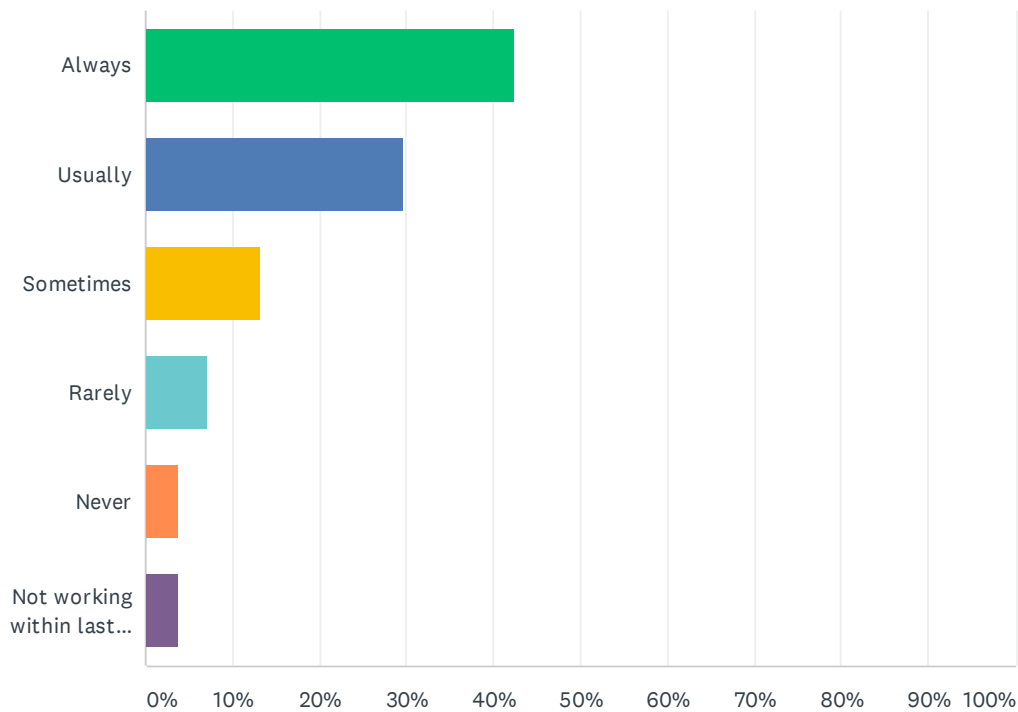

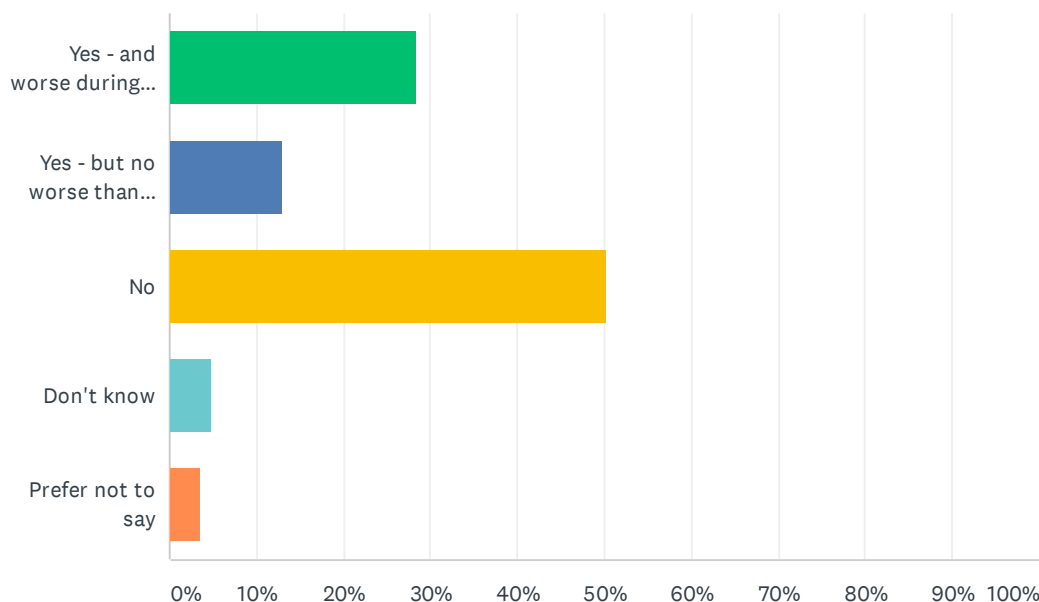

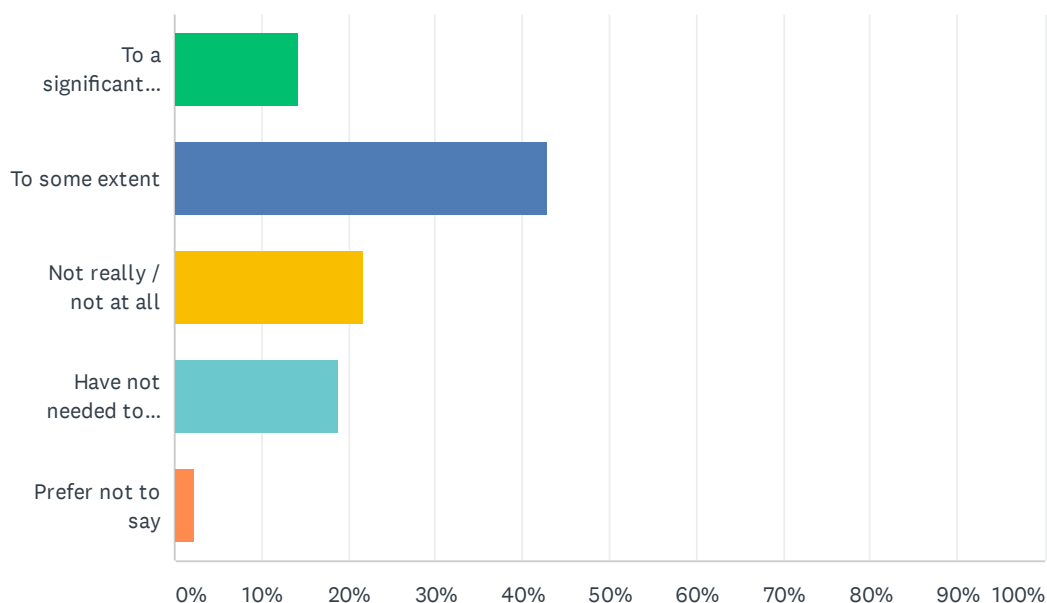

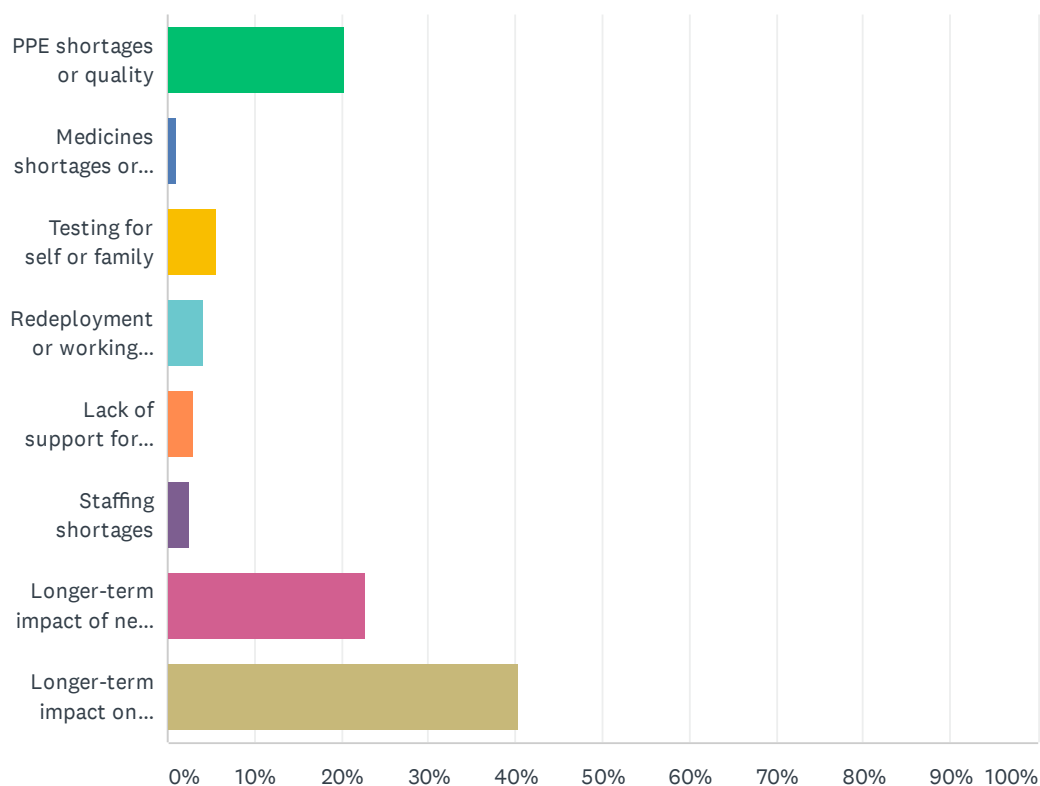
