




During this pandemic have you had to access NHS wellbeing support services provided by either your employer or a third party?


Do you believe that you previously have, or may have, contracted Coronavirus?






Have you sought any support for these continuing symptoms?


Are you (or someone for whom you have caring responsibilities or live with) clinically extremely vulnerable and currently shielding, or have you been previously shielded?




Have you received any support from your place of work whilst shielding?


Do you have an agreed return to work date?






How long after your test for coronavirus did it take to get the results?


Staff who work in the NHS are eligible for an antibody test, which shows whether someone has previously been infected by the coronavirus. Have you tried to access an antibody test?


How long after your antibody test did it take to get the results?





If you employ locums in your practice / department / place of work, how difficult has it been to recruit these during the period of the pandemic?




How has your financial situation changed as a result of the amount of locum work you were able to do during the pandemic?






Have you ever felt pressured to see a patient without adequate protection?


Taking everything into account, do you feel safely protected from coronavirus infection in your place of work?








Within the last week, what change, if any, have you experienced in the level of demand for non-Covid patient care?


How confident are you about your ability to manage patient demand as normal NHS services are resumed?


Within the last week, have you seen any change in the number of Covid cases?

How confident are you about your ability to manage patient demand if there is a second peak of Covid-19 (national or local)?






Does your place of work / local health economy have in place plans to manage local surges in Covid cases (e.g. during local lockdowns)?


Thinking about your place of work, how confident are you that you have been supplied with adequate numbers of facemasks or face coverings for patients that needed them?

To what extent, if at all, do you agree that the use of face coverings should be made mandatory in all settings where social distancing is not possible?




Have you restarted medical education and training activities in your place of work?


Thinking about your place of work, how confident are you that you have been supplied with sufficient PPE to enable medical students to return to clinical placements?

Have you restarted research activities in your place of work?






Assuming there are no future Covid spikes, how quickly, if at all, will your department / practice / place of work / local health economy return to full (pre-Covid) levels of capacity?








Has your practice restarted any of the following?




Which posts did you have difficulty recruiting to?


