

Claim tax relief on your annual BMA subscription

Your British Medical Association (BMA) subscription

Under section 344 of the Income Tax (Earnings & Pensions) Act 2003, the membership fee paid as an annual subscription to the BMA (being a professional body) may be allowable as a deduction from earnings from an employment.

You may be able to claim for the current year, and for earlier tax years on this form. The tax year begins on April 6th in one year and ends on April 5th the following year. To request details of your BMA subscription payments please email membership@bma.org.uk

Please note: You may not be able to claim tax relief on all of your annual BMA subscription and your claim may also depend on your personal circumstances.

Other subscriptions and fees

You may also be able to claim tax relief on fees and subscriptions to other professional bodies, dependent upon your personal circumstances. Please refer to [HMRC guidance](#) for a list of eligible organisations and please contact the relevant organisation for full details of their subscription or fee.
