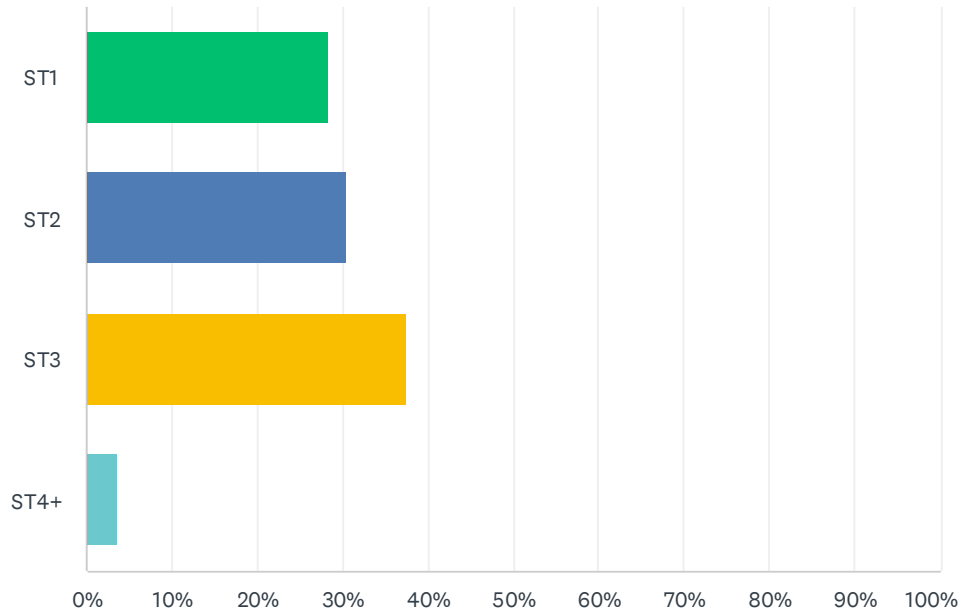

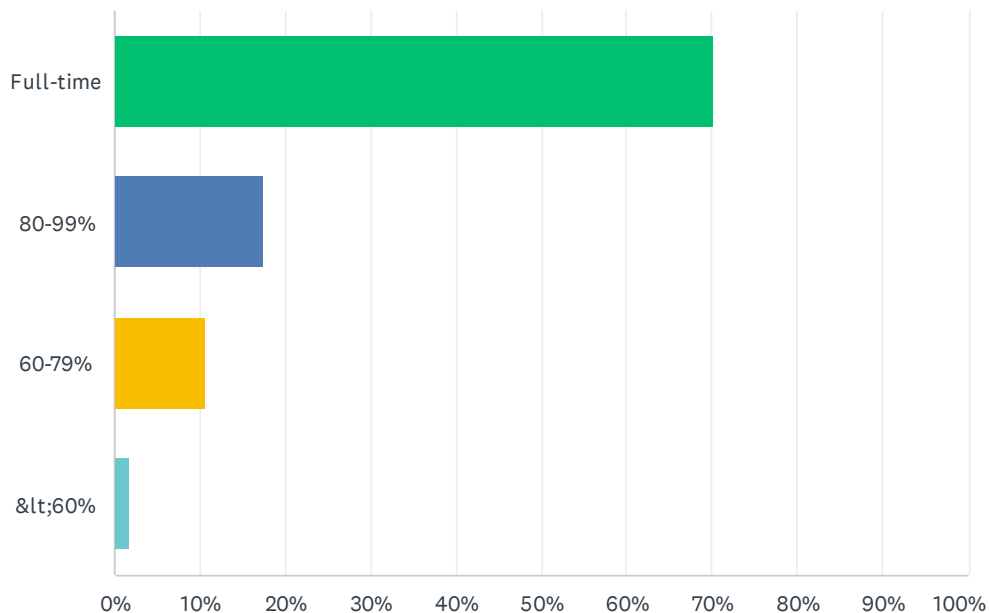

Q3 Are you full-time or less-than-full-time (LTFT)? If you are on a career break, please answer with your most recent role

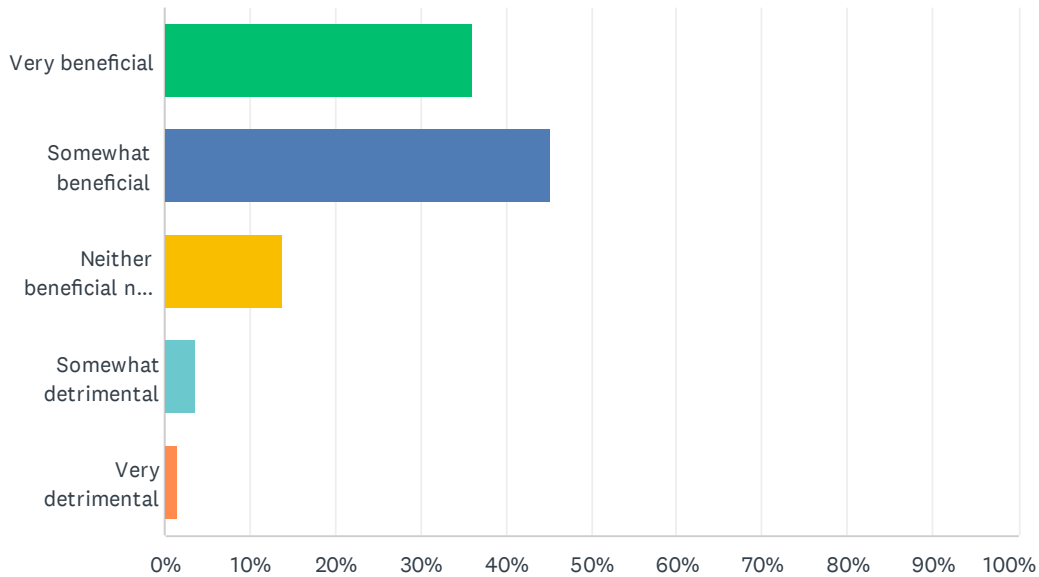

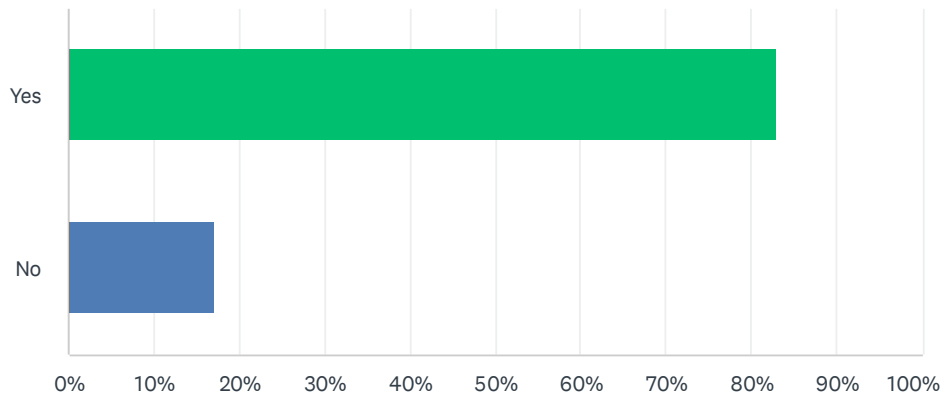

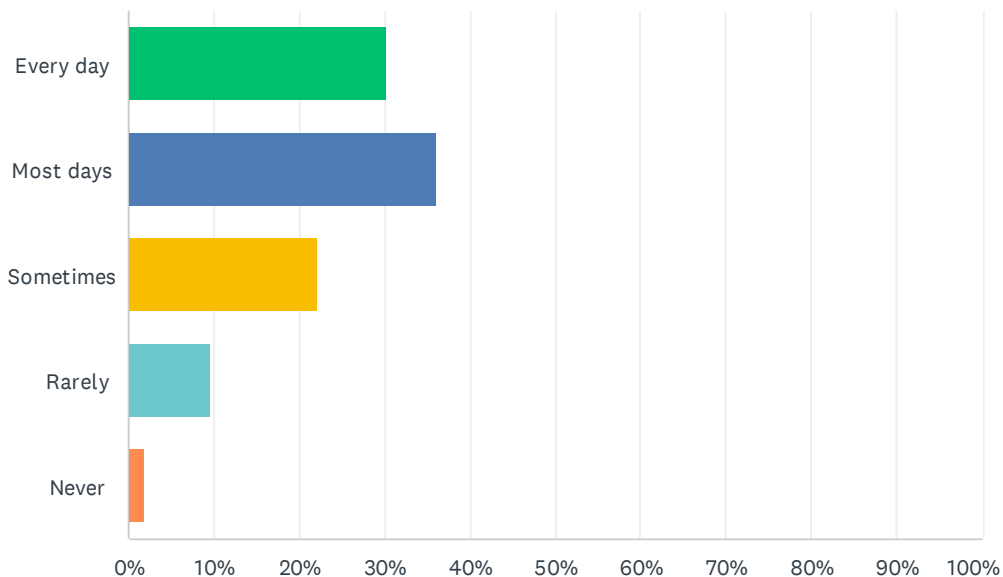

Q6 How often do you work outside of your scheduled working hours (including during your break, starting early or staying late) in a GP setting?

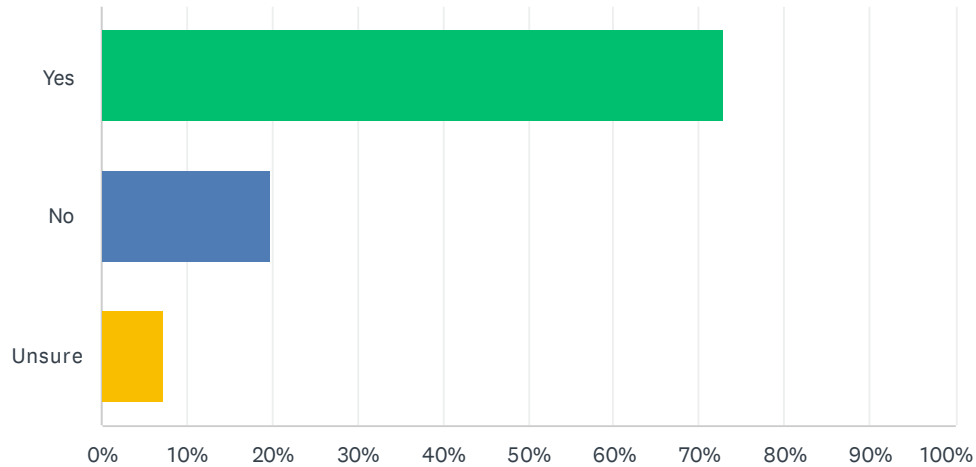

Q7 Have you experienced symptoms of burnout, stress, anxiety or depression whilst working in GP setting?

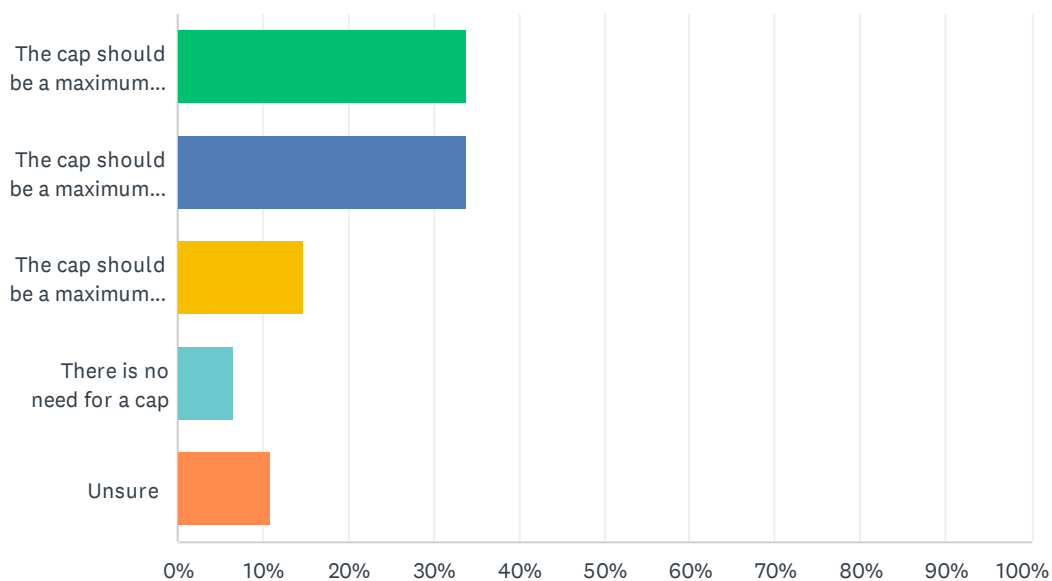

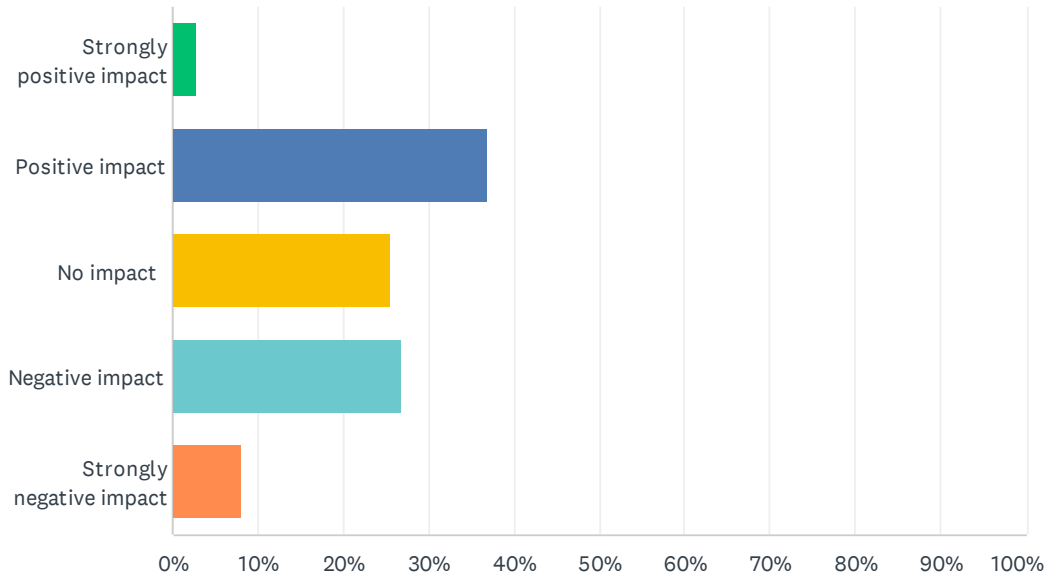

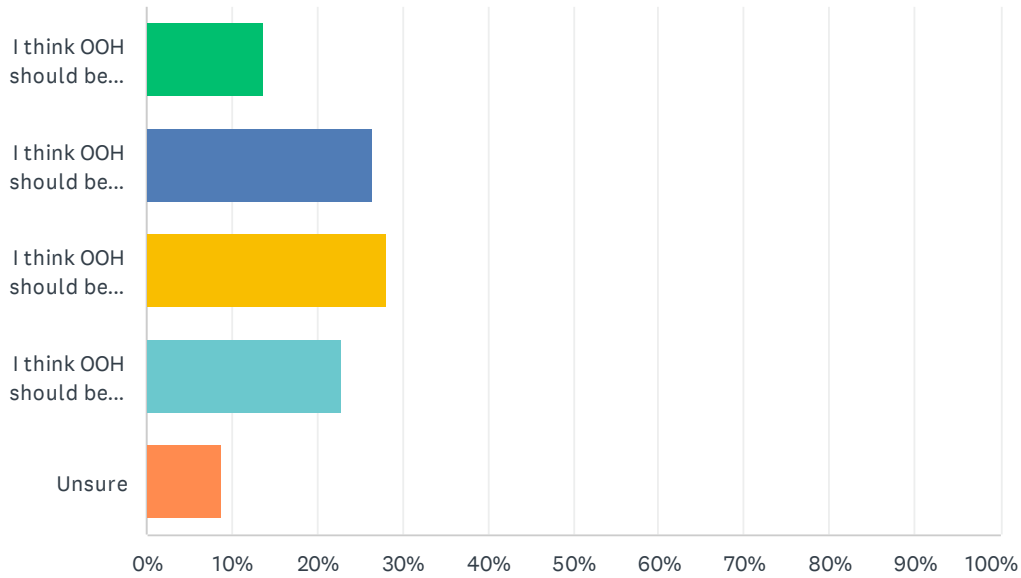

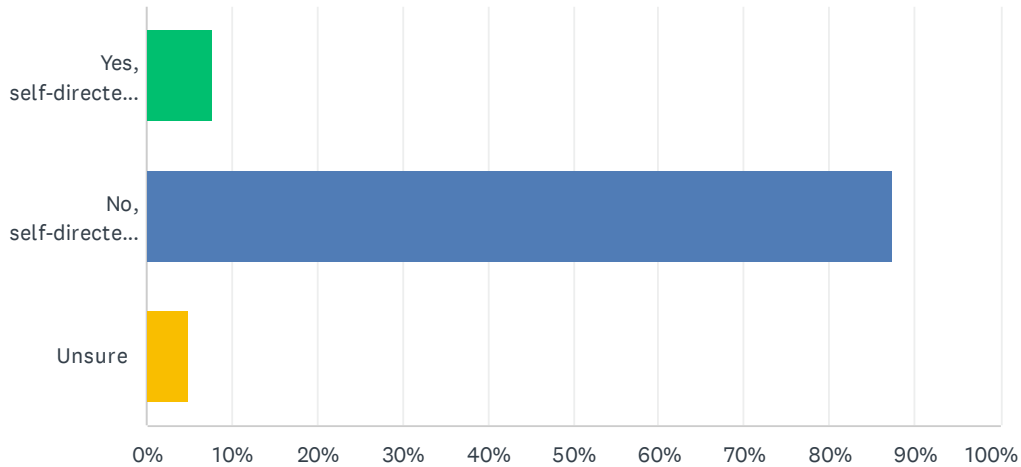

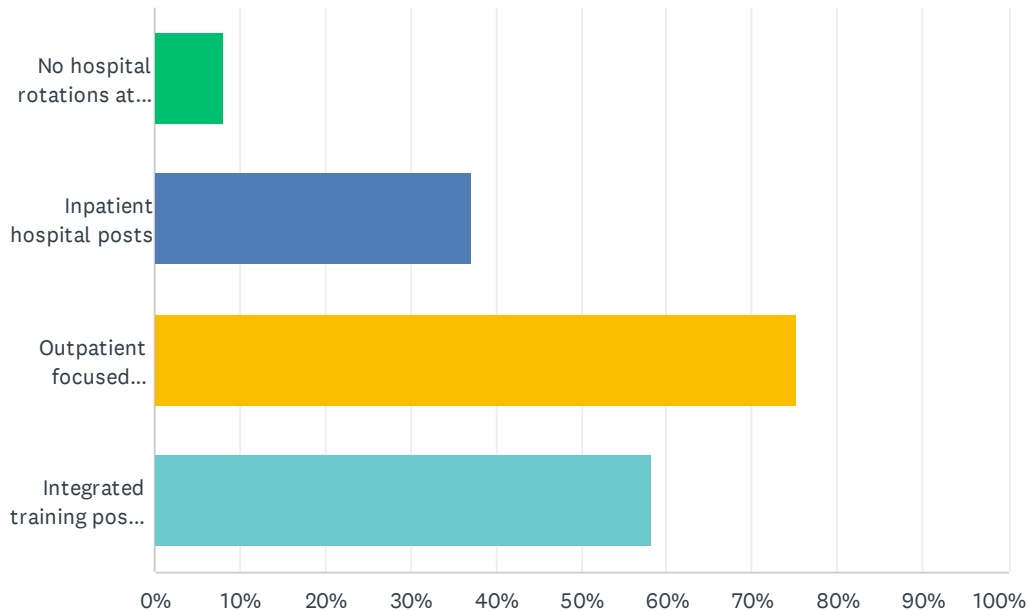

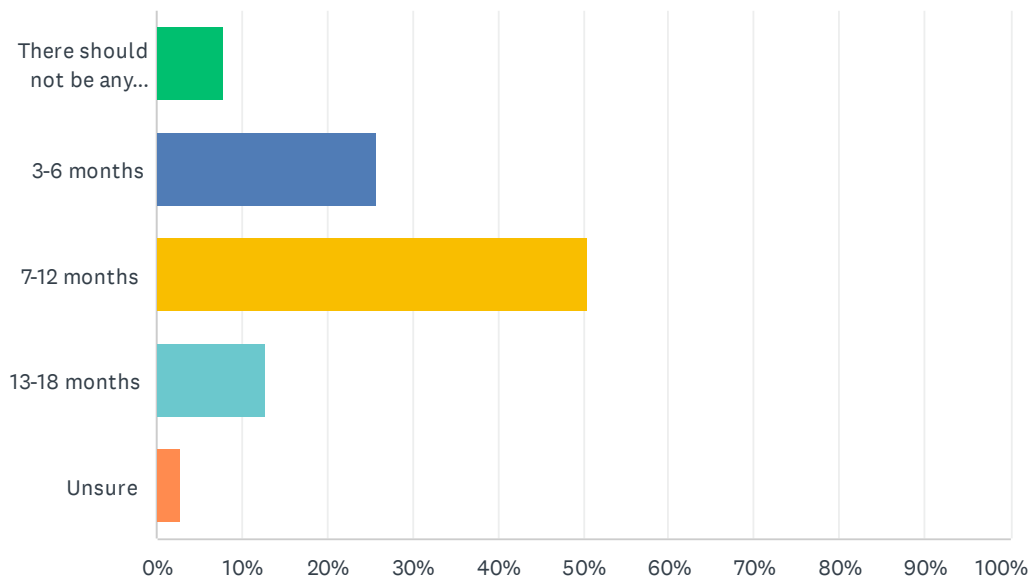

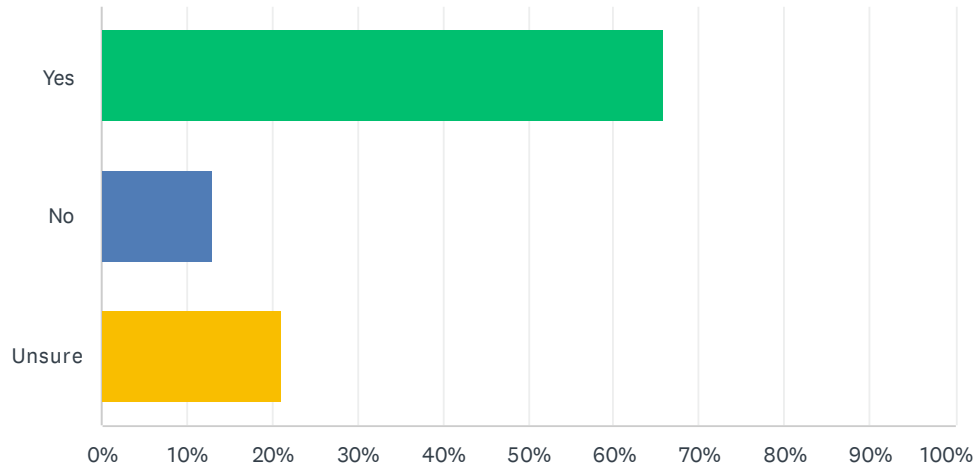

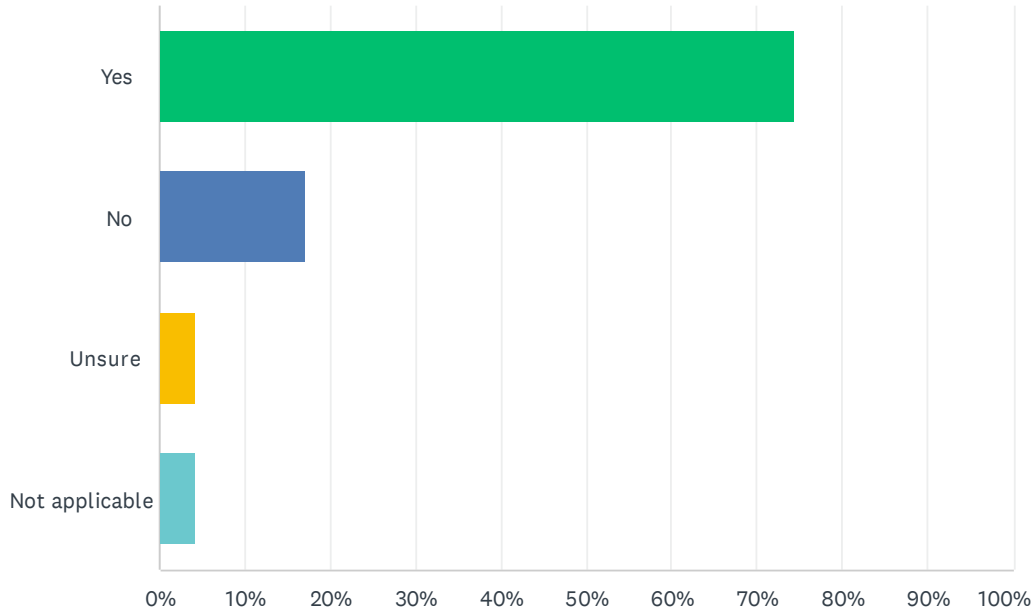

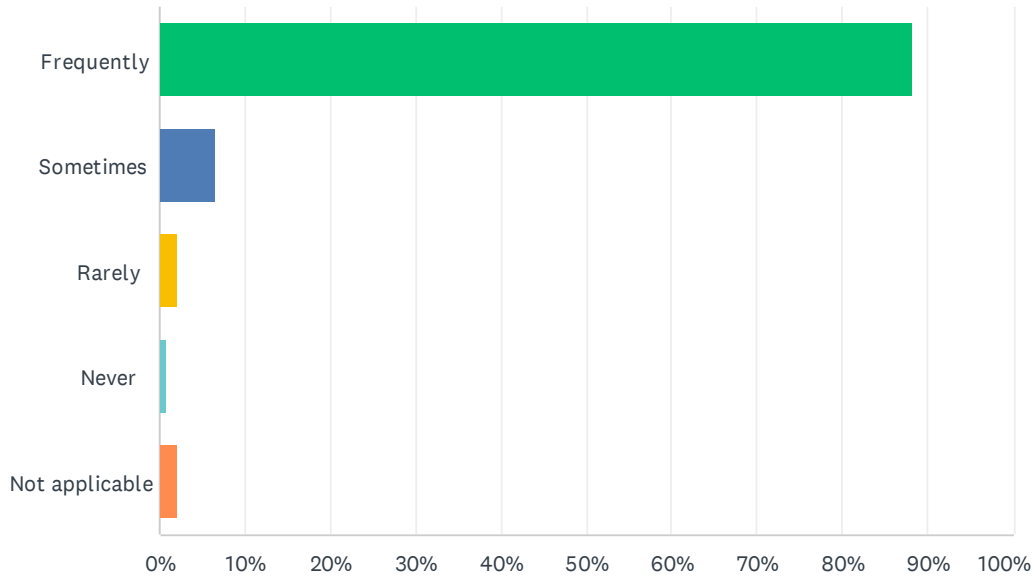

Q16 How often have you had to complete portfolio work in your own time, outside of working hours whilst in a hospital setting?

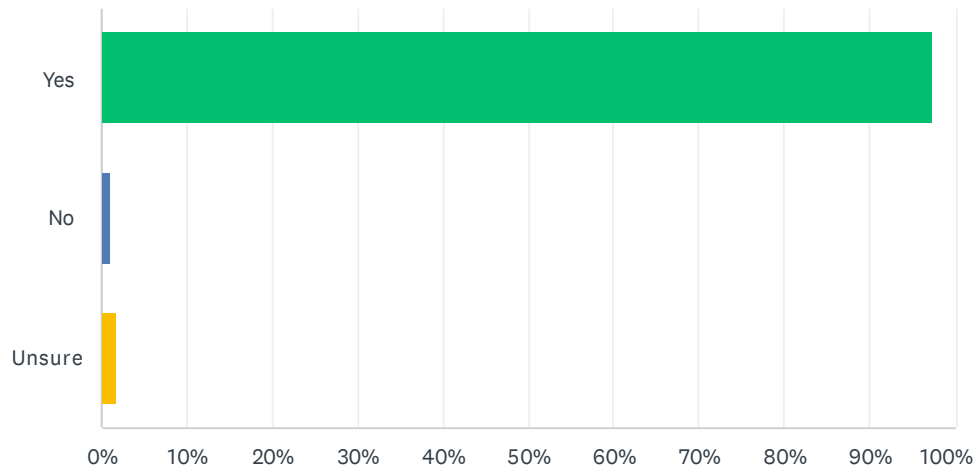

Q17 Should self-development time be mandatory during all hospital posts?

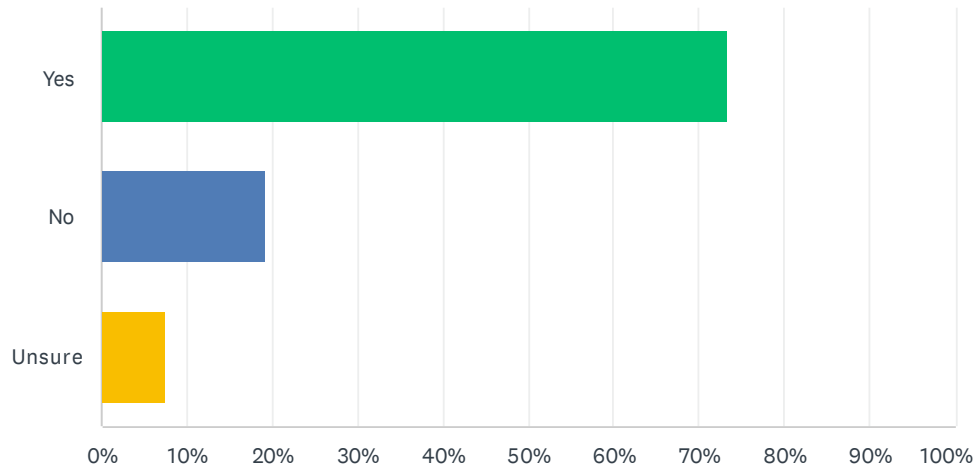

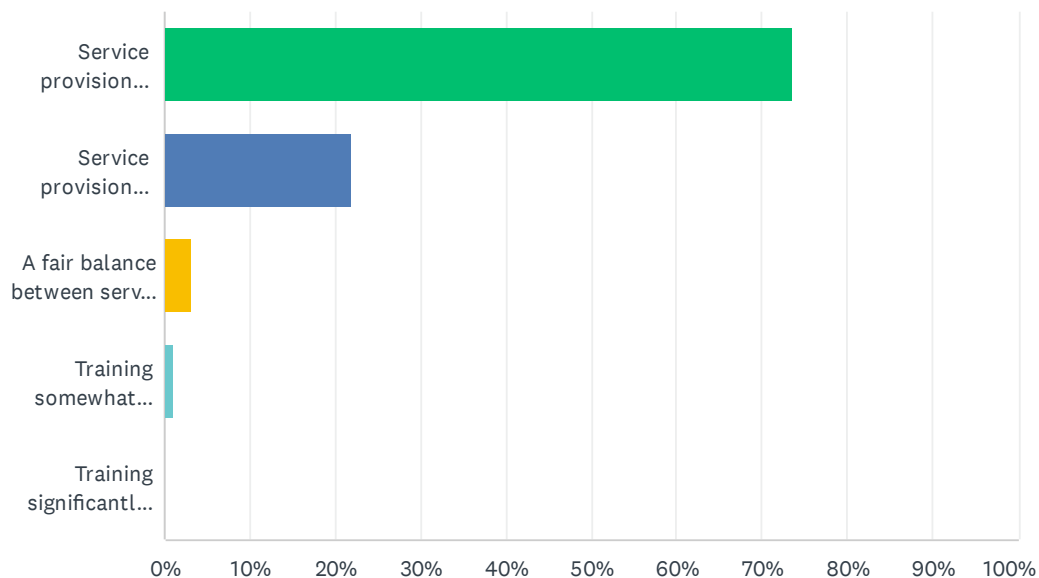

Q19 Regarding the balance between service provision and training, how would you describe your experience working in hospital posts as a GP registrar in Scotland?

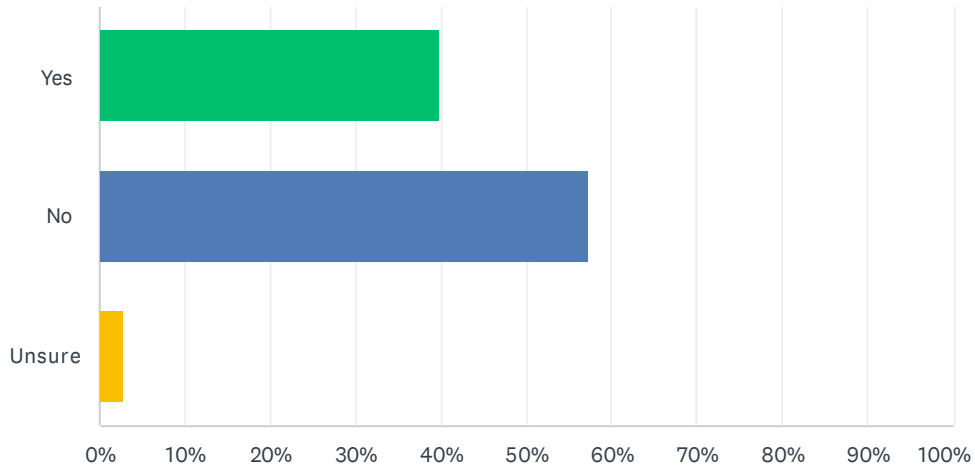

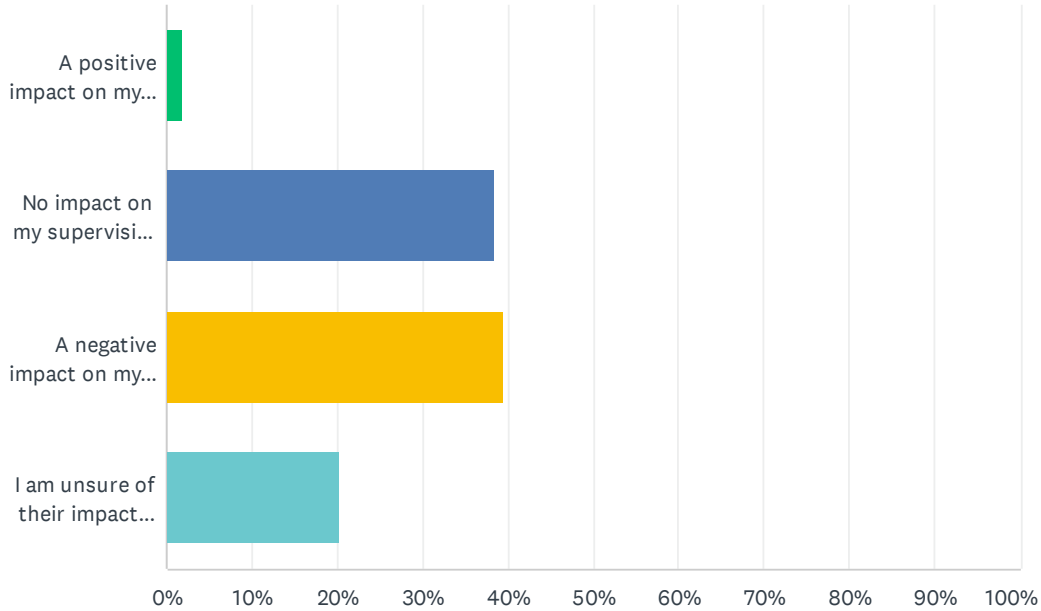

Q21 Regarding your supervision or debriefing by qualified GPs in general practice, I have found that physician associates have had:

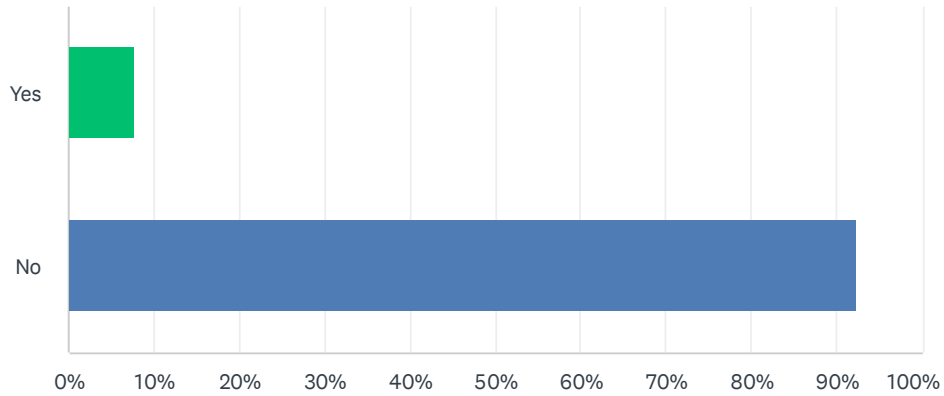

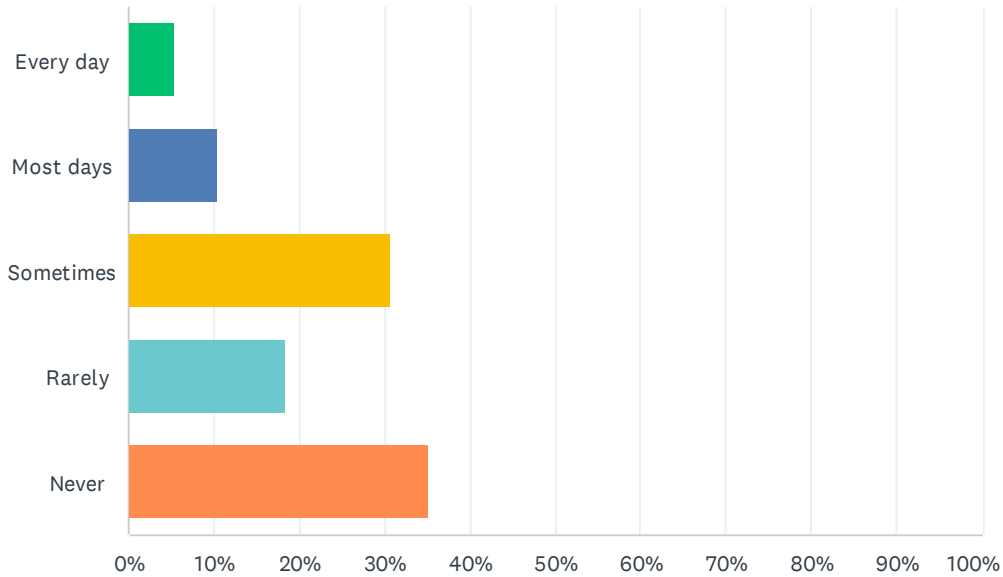

Q23 While in a GP post, how often have you been asked to prescribe/request imaging for physician associates?

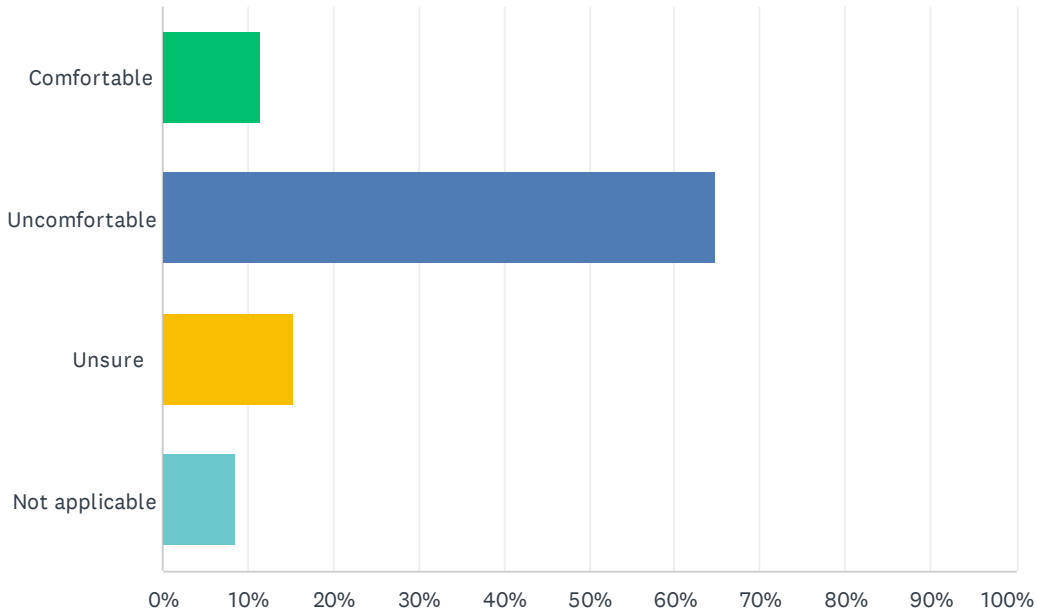

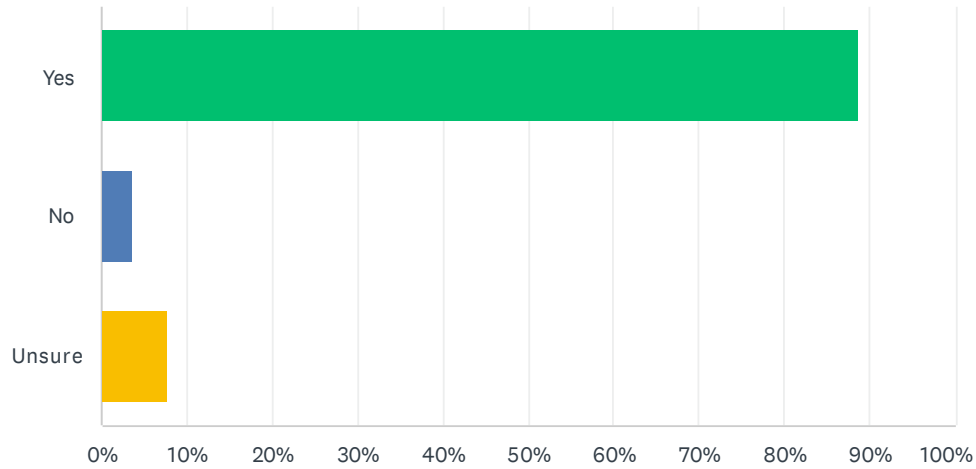

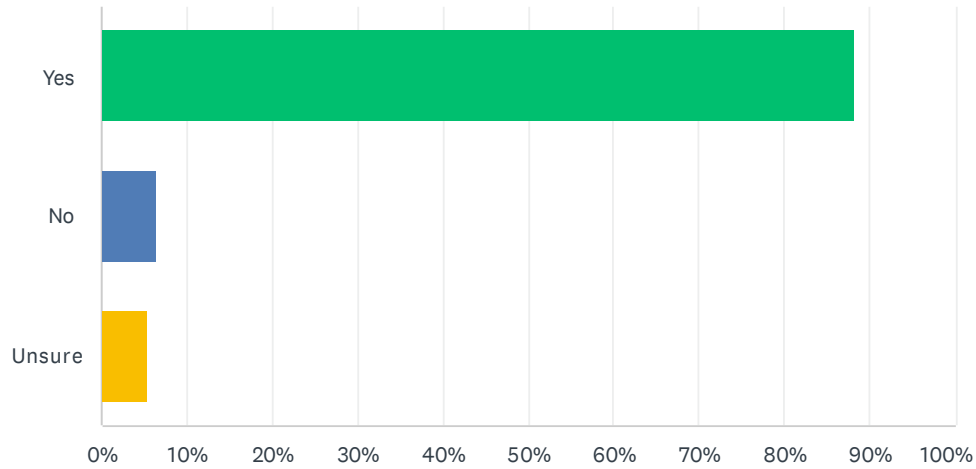

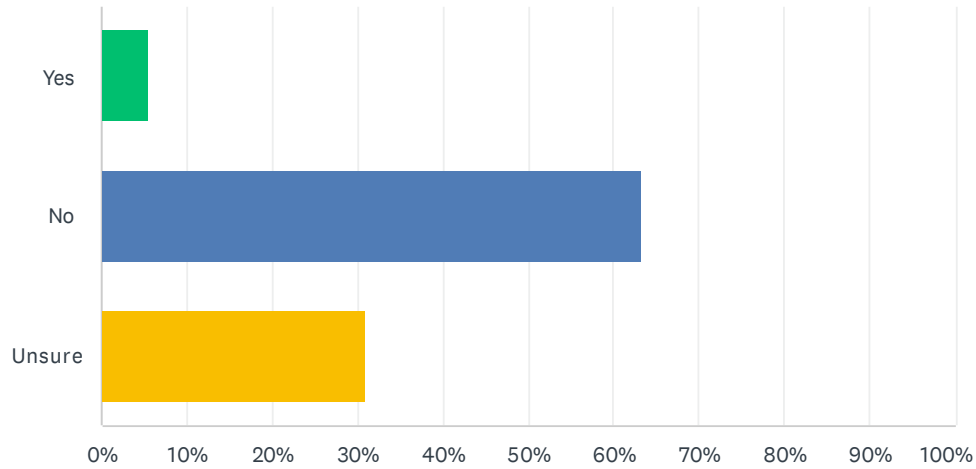

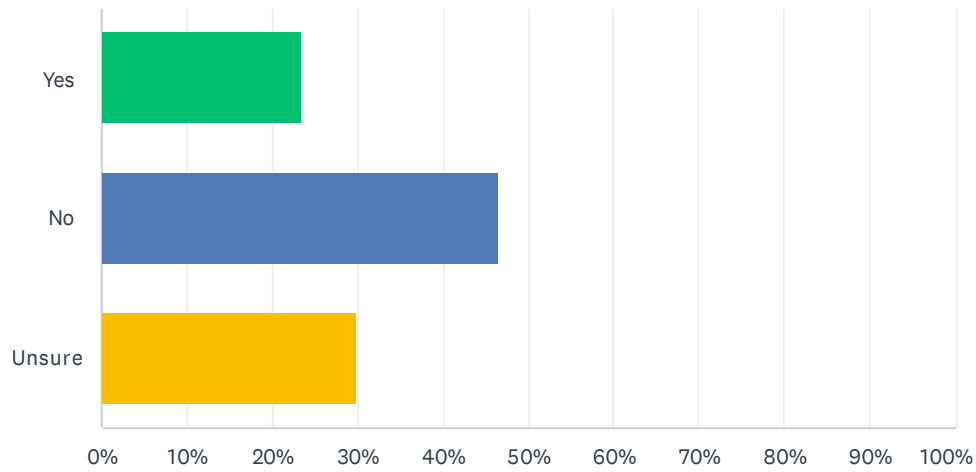

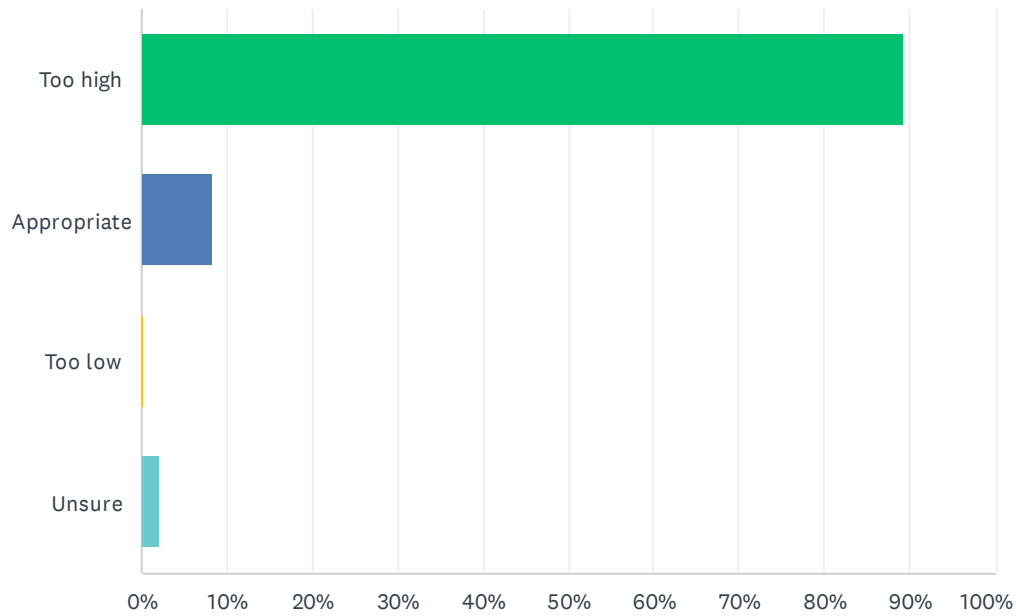

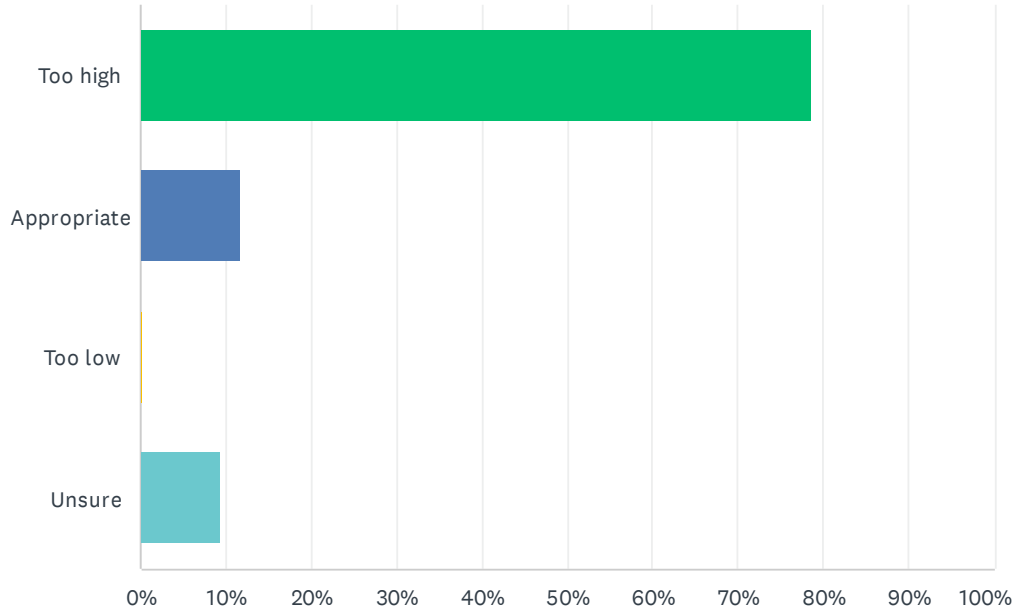

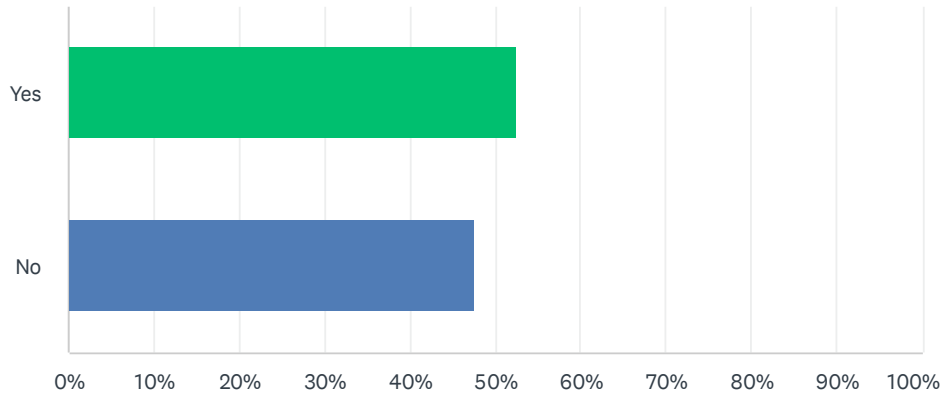

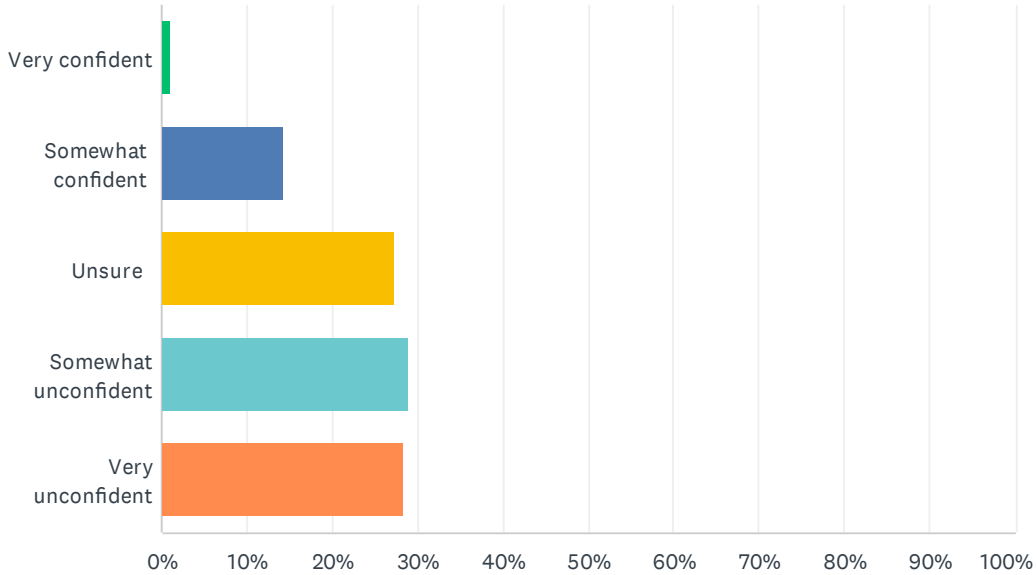

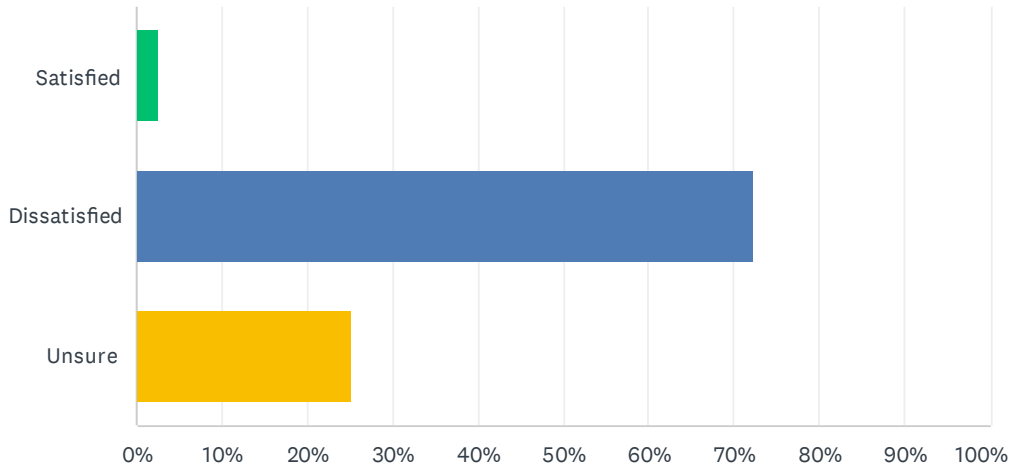

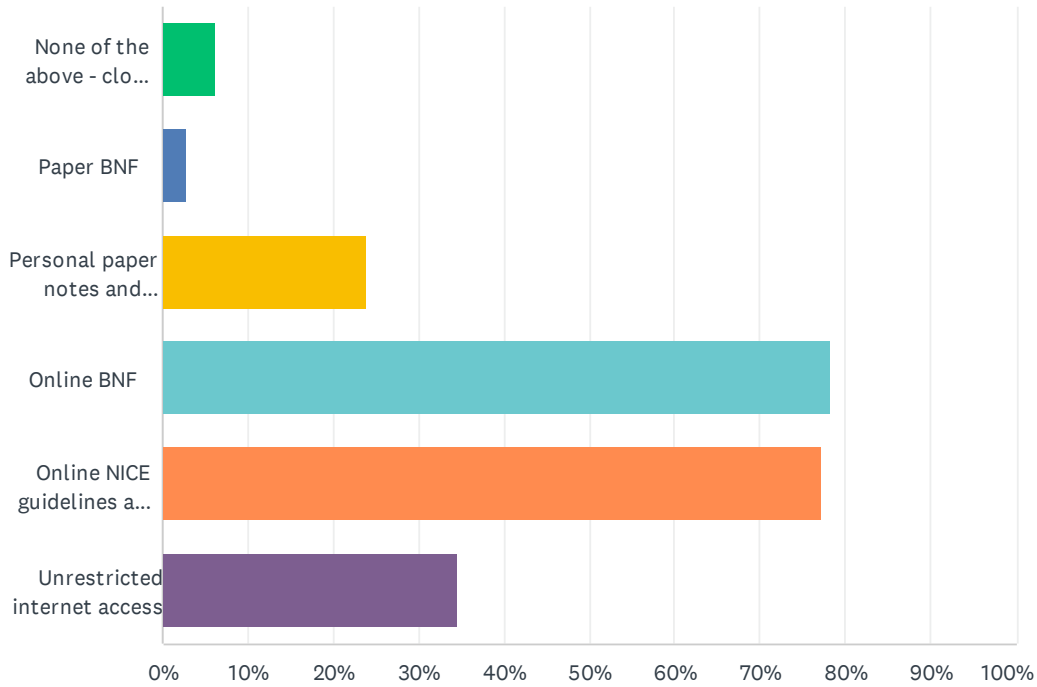

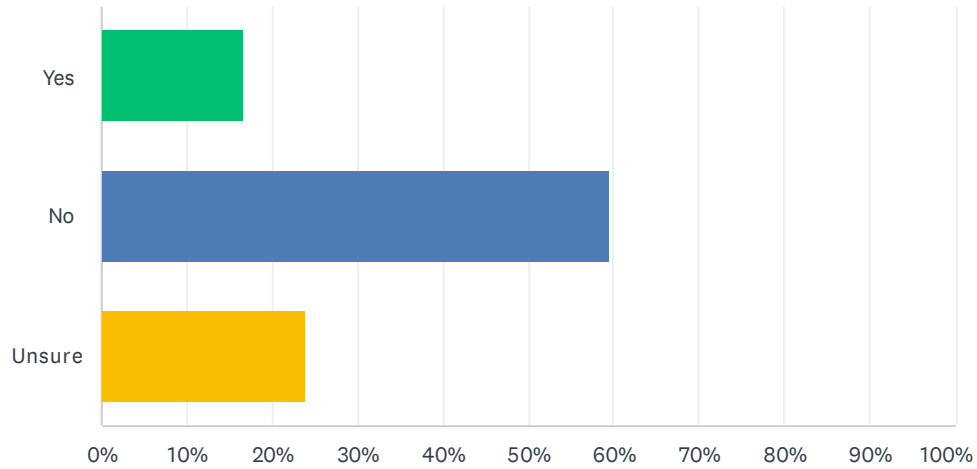

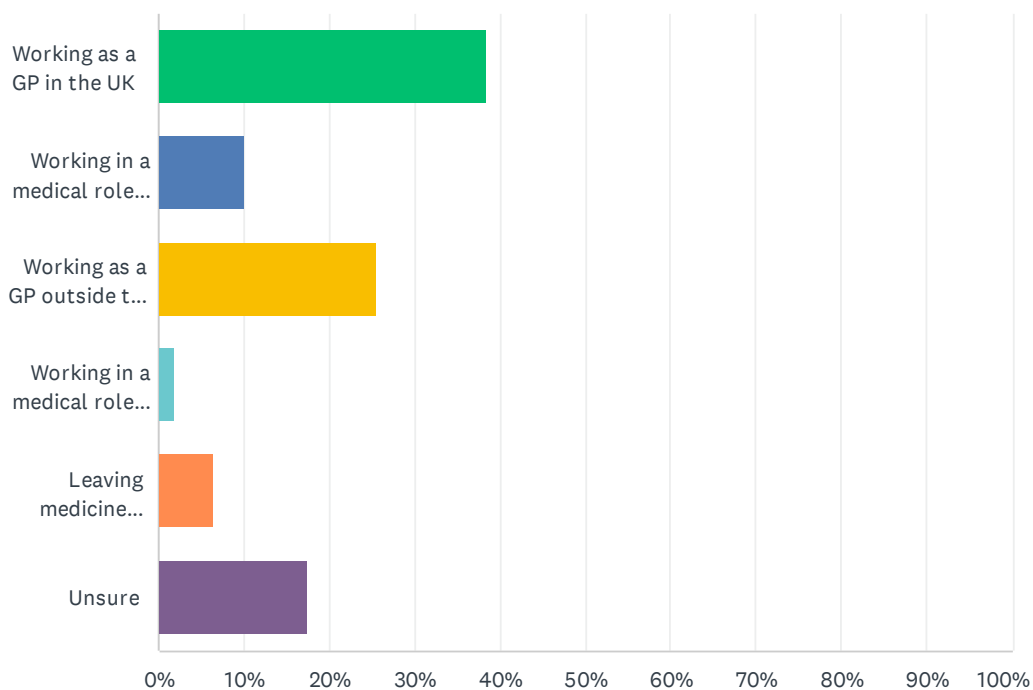

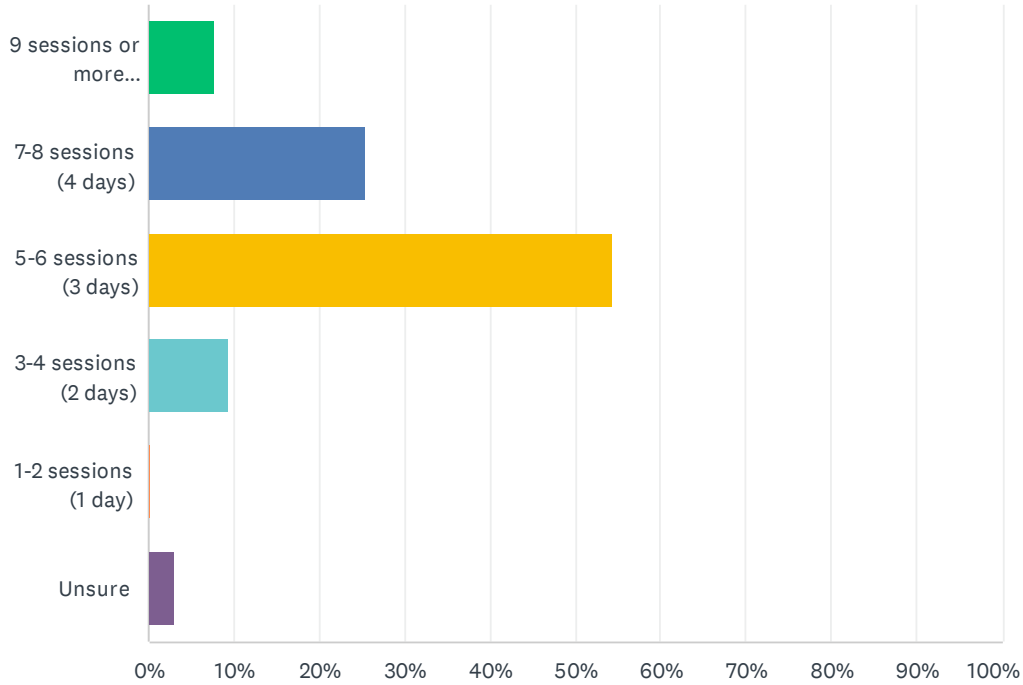

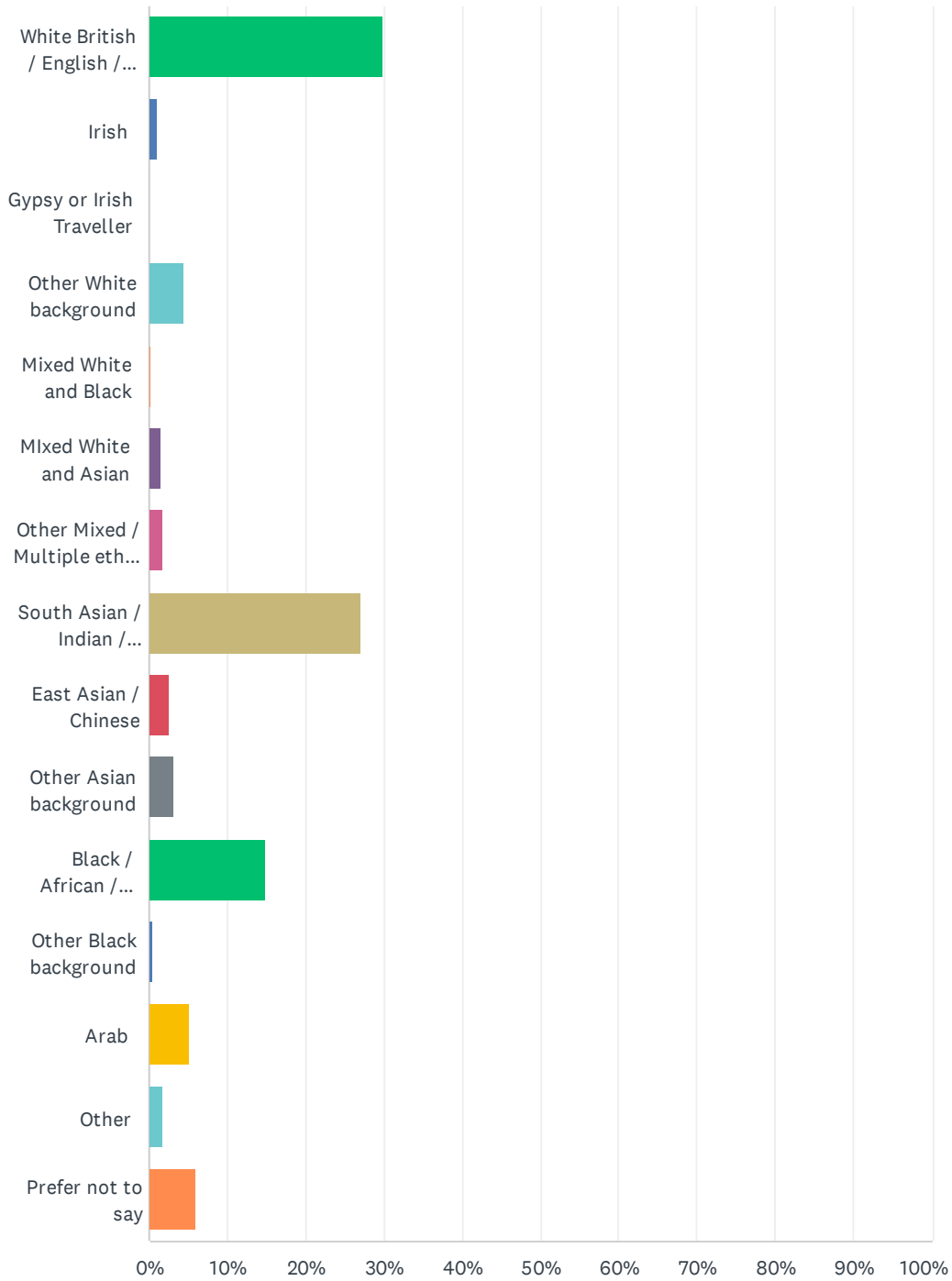

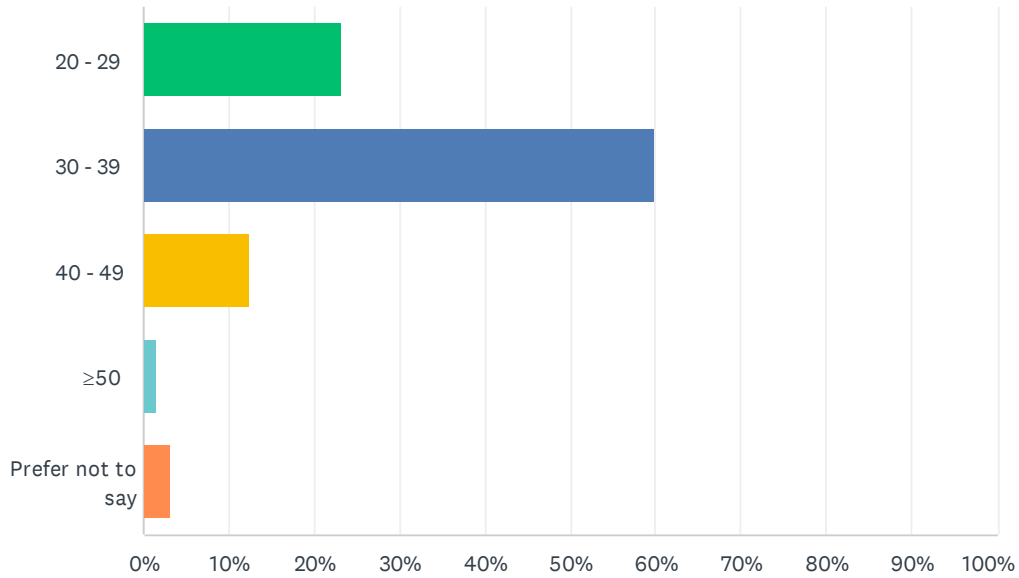

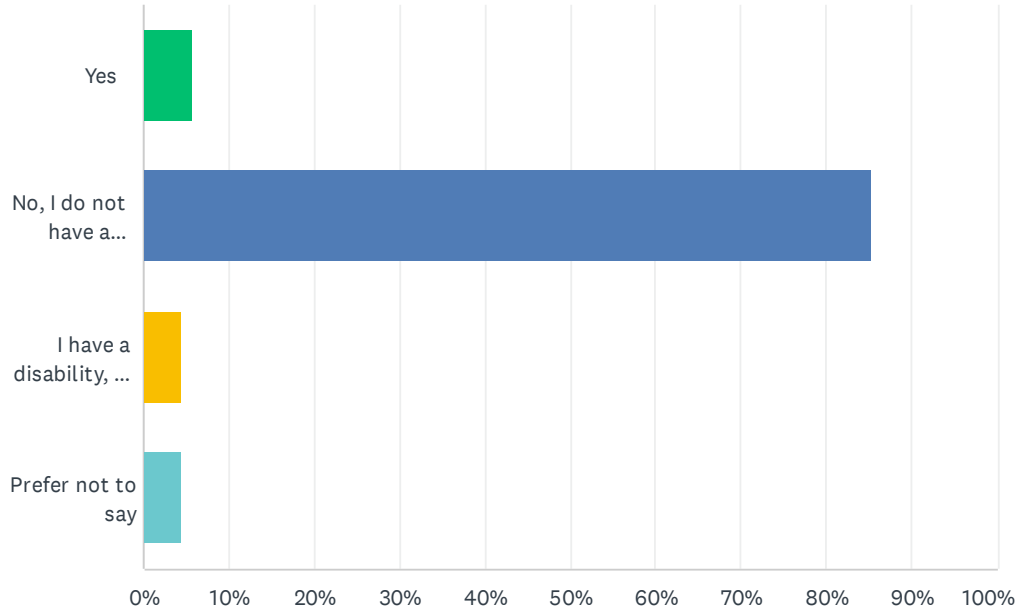

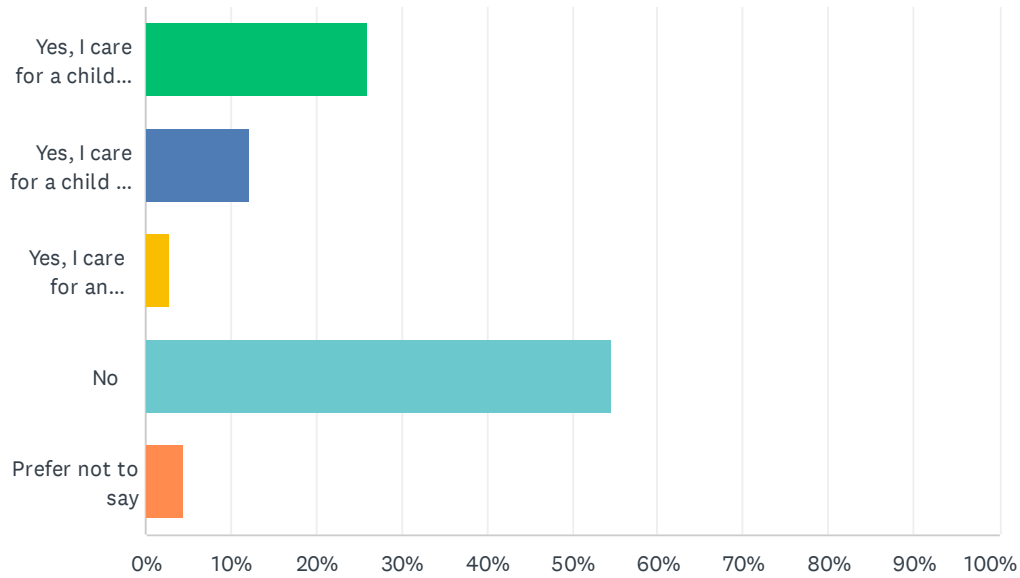
