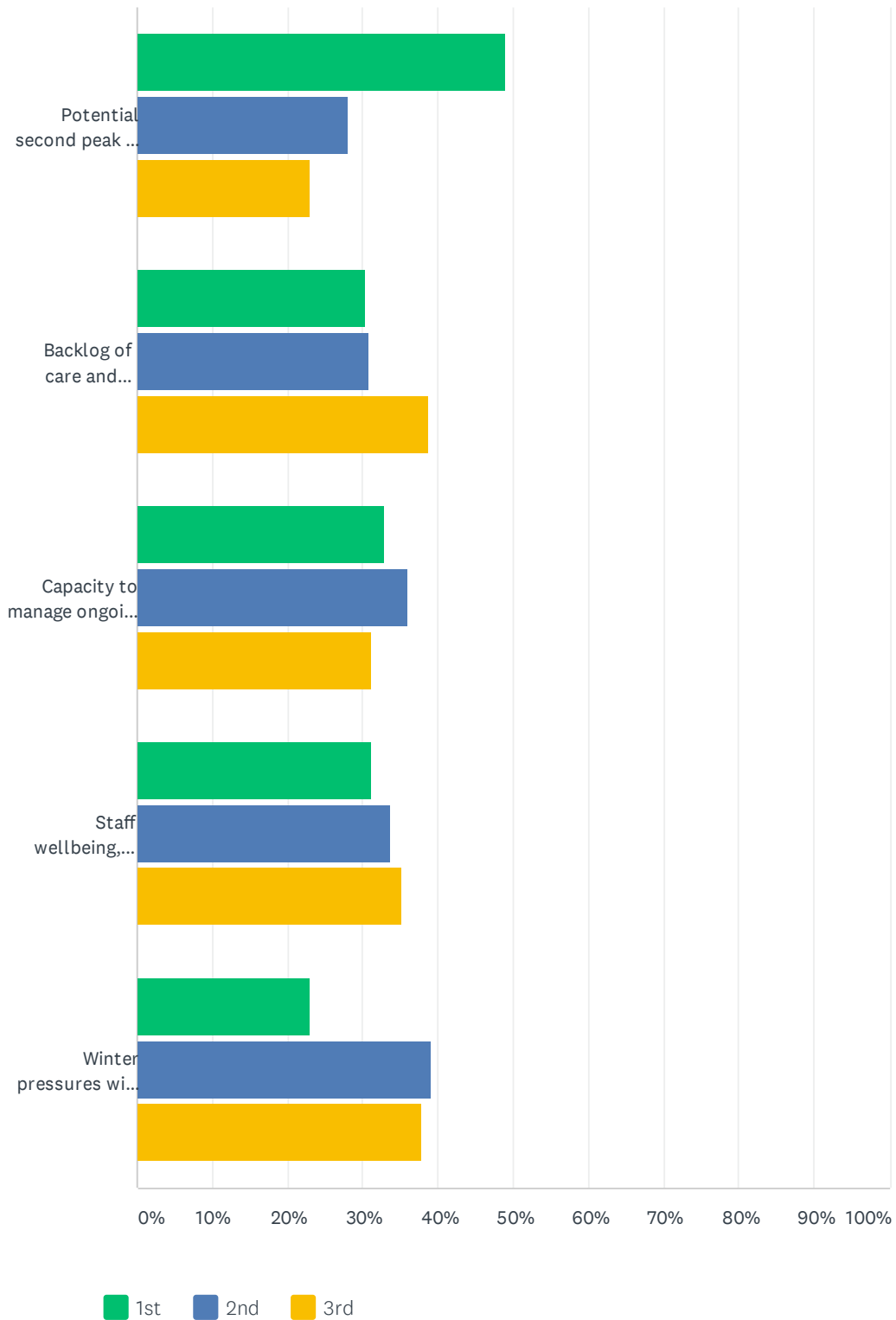


### Q3 What are your biggest concerns for the health service this winter? Please rank your top three concerns.

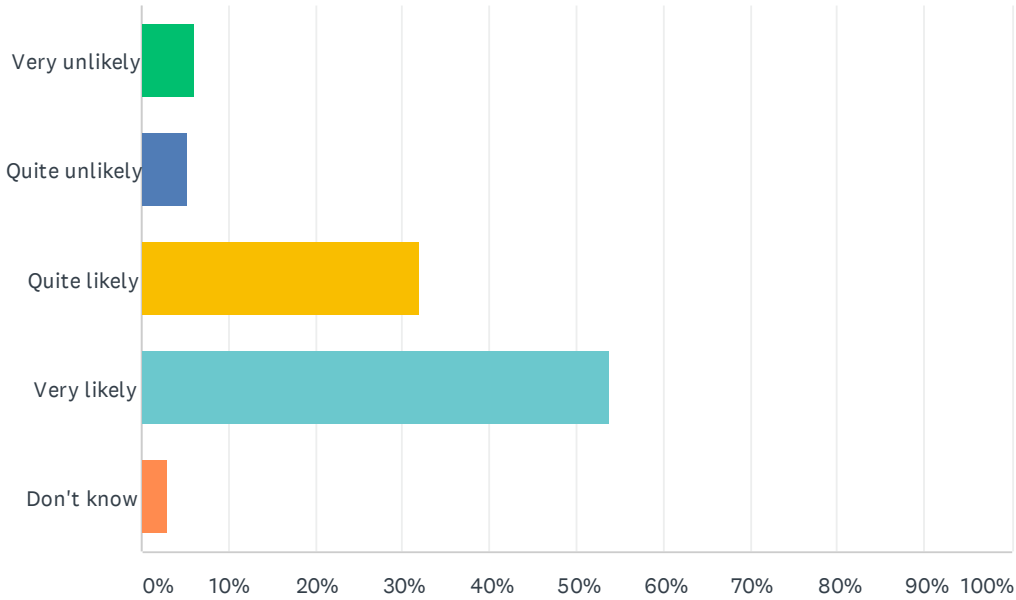

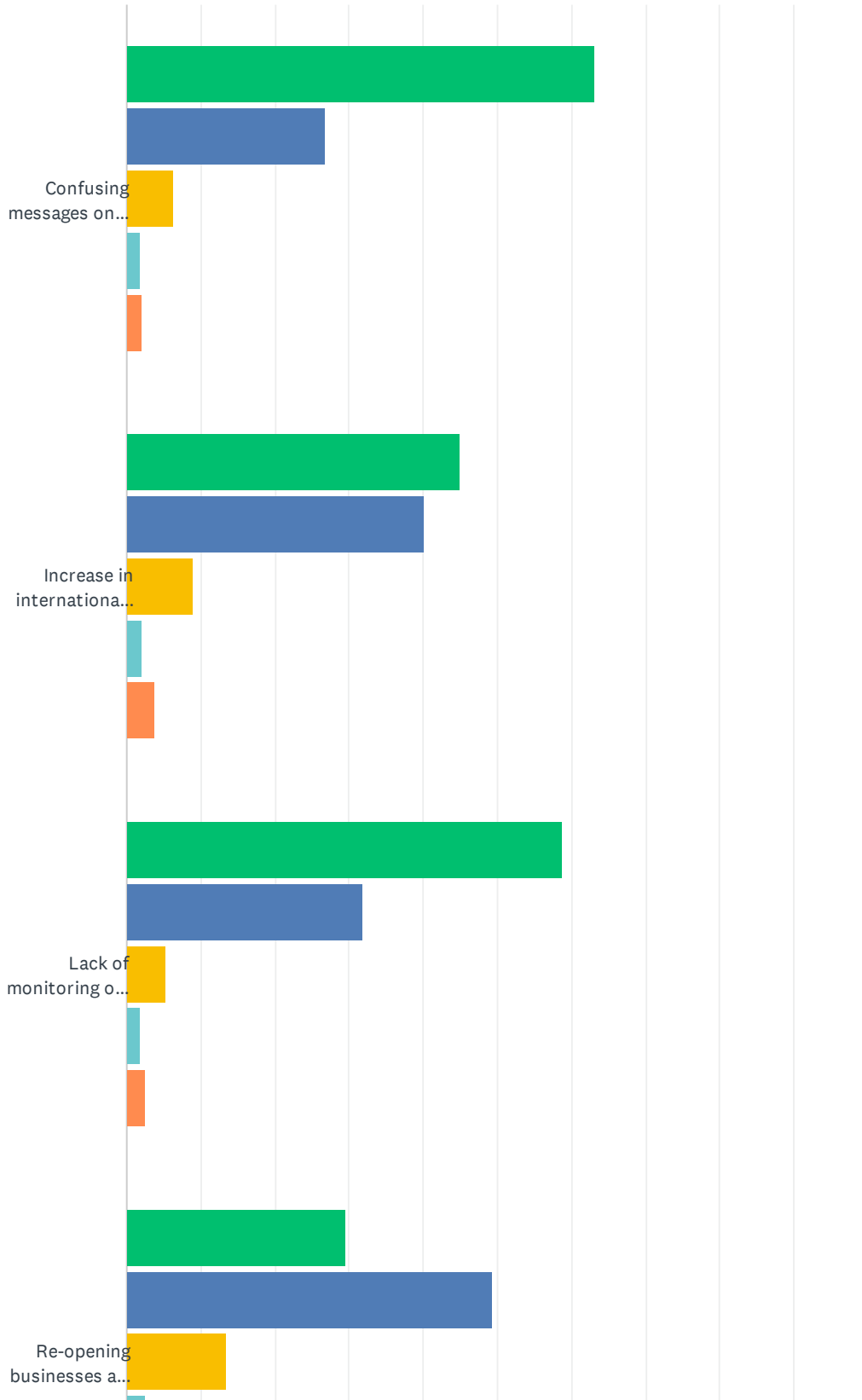

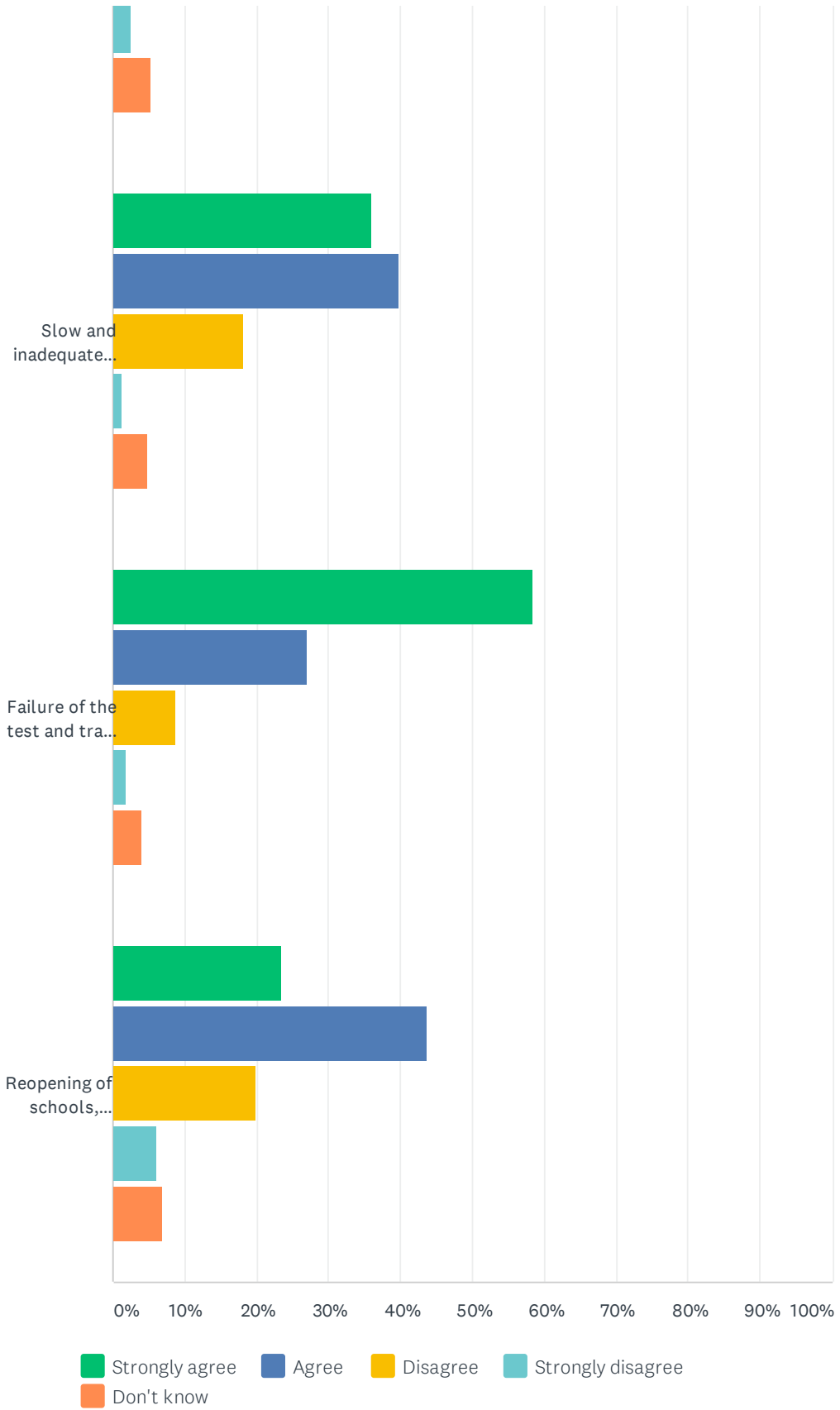

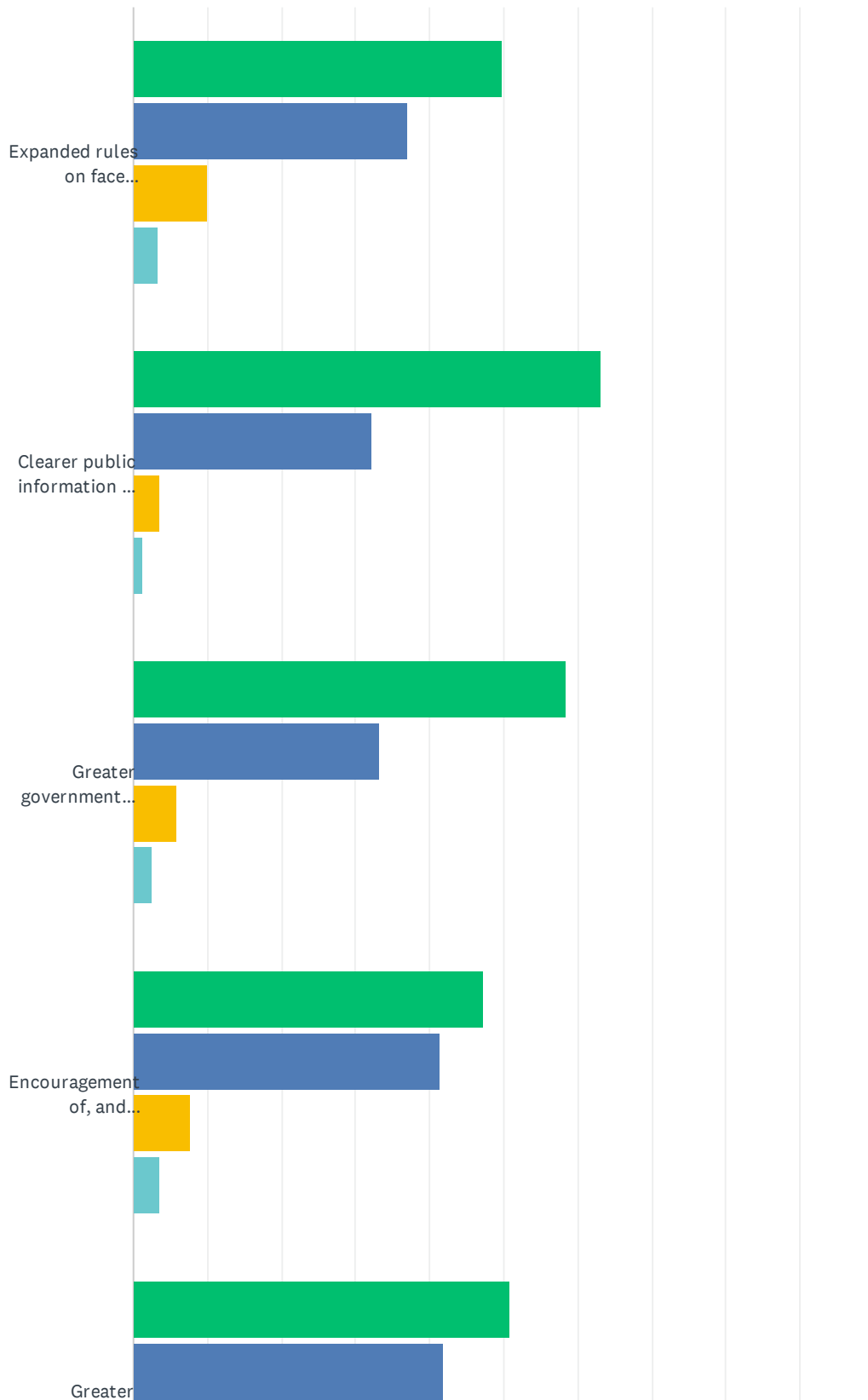

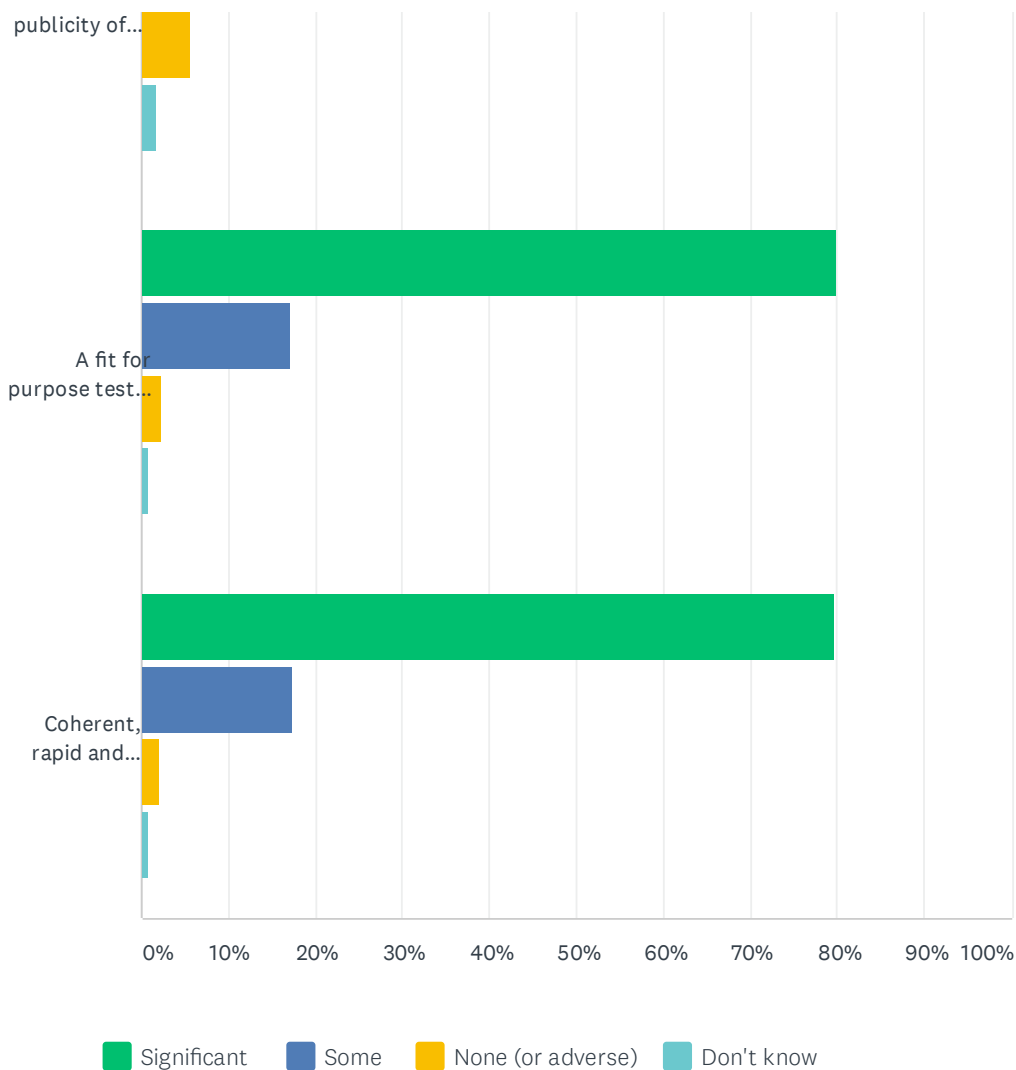

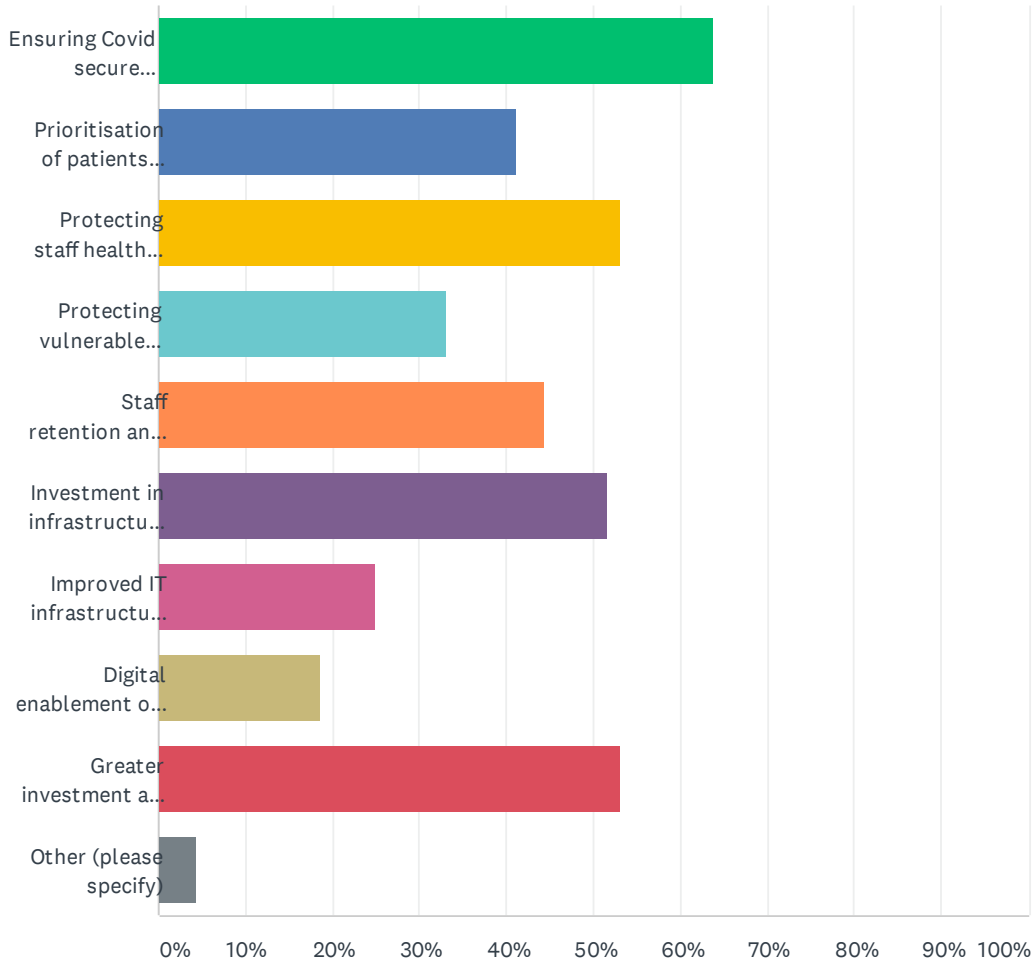
