






















Over the last two weeks, have you had adequate NHS supplies or shortages of the following PPE?

Are you being offered access to routine asymptomatic testing in your place of work?





Within the last two weeks, have you seen any change in the number of Covid cases during the Winter season / second wave of the pandemic?



How confident are you about your department / practice's ability to manage demand from patients with Covid symptoms during the winter season / second wave of the pandemic?



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








How concerned, if at all, are you about the impact of anti-vaccination messaging impacting the uptake of the vaccine?

Have you personally been notified about when you will receive a Covid-19 vaccination?



To what extent, if at all, do you expect the vaccination programme will increase or decrease your workload over the next few months?








