Attacks on physicians in Sudan and on Omdurman Hospital

Your Excellency

I am writing to you on behalf of the British Medical Association to express our grave concern about recent reports, substantiated by Amnesty International and the World Medical Association, that the Sudanese Government has used lethal force against protesters, including physicians, and that on 9 January 2019, Sudanese security forces attacked Omdurman Hospital in pursuit of protesters.

The intentional targeting of health professionals, including hospitals and medical facilities, is a clear breach of the Geneva Conventions of 1949 and of International Humanitarian Law, as well as accepted international human rights norms. Health professionals provide a necessary service, and it is essential that they are at liberty to provide that service without fear of being targeted.

We urge you to take immediate steps to ensure there are no further attacks on health professionals or medical facilities by Sudanese security forces, and to ensure that the attack on Omdurman Hospital is investigated impartially and the perpetrators are held accountable.
